### Fun with Numbers

GRADE K

### Mathemagicians

GRADE 1

GRADES 2-3

Students working at or slightly above grade level will reinforce their mathematical thinking and skills in basic operations.

## Registration Information

ONLINE REGISTRATION**

### Registration

Registration begins Monday, March 2, at 8:00 a.m. and must be completed online at the District website, [www.d64.org](http://www.d64.org). Access program information and registration through the “Worlds of Wonder” link.

Session 1 registration will be open through Thursday, June 18, and Session 2 through Wednesday, July 8. If you need to make a change to your online registration, please call 847-318-8100 x 7201 or email [curriculum@d64.org](mailto:curriculum@d64.org).

Apply early. Many classes fill quickly. Priority will be given to children who reside in District 64 and enroll on or before April 17. Non-District 64 residents may not register before April 18 and must pay an increased tuition rate.

Online payment must be made by debit or credit card (Discover, Visa, and MasterCard only). Online registrations will not be processed without full payment.

**Refunds will be given only if a class is cancelled for insufficient enrollment. Classes cannot be changed once summer school begins.**



### Selecting the Proper Class

Students may enroll in a maximum of 2 classes per session. Some classes may be offered at only one class time — consult the Class Schedule Planner for scheduled class times. **Each class has a unique Class Number based on the time and session. Be sure to note this Class Number as this will make online registration easier.** Look for classes that indicate the grade your child will complete by the end of the 2014–15 school year. Children should select a class in which they are interested and seem best qualified. If you have questions about your child’s ability, please consult with his or her current teacher. Based on your child’s needs, your child’s classroom teacher may recommend a basic skill-building class. **If your child has a food allergy, please consider whether a foods class would be appropriate.** A child who is inappropriately placed will be reevaluated by staff and possibly reassigned to a more suitable class.

### Tuition and Fees\*

#### If paid on/before April 17:

Each three-week class \$105  
Each six-week class \$210

#### If paid after April 17:

Each three-week class \$125  
Each six-week class \$250

\*Additional fees may be assessed for special materials. A \$ in the class description denotes when an additional fee is due.

Tuition and fees are non-refundable.

### Absences

**Parents must notify the Franklin School office at (847) 318-4390 before 8:15 a.m. if their child will be absent.**

The school secretary will contact parents if an absence has not been confirmed. Vacations or a prolonged illness should be reported in advance.

### Transportation

Students may walk or be driven to school. Students who ride or use a bike, skateboard, or rollerblades must wear a helmet to and from school, according to District policy. The Park Ridge Park District provides shuttle service for students attending summer camp after class. Please refer to its brochure for details.

### Medication at School

Most medication can and should be timed to be taken at home. If it becomes necessary for your child to take or keep medication at school, a medication form must be completed by you and your child’s physician. This applies to both prescription and over-the-counter medication. The Medication Authorization Form can be found on the District website at [www.d64.org](http://www.d64.org) or can be obtained from any school health office. Medication must be provided in a labeled prescription bottle or in original packaging.

If documentation is already on file in the school health office, no further paperwork is necessary. In the case of asthma inhalers only, parent signature is required on the medication form; however, the pharmacy label from the inhaler may substitute for the physician’s signature. The label must include the student name, date, and dose and timing of medication. Parents must pick up all medication by the last day of summer school.

### Emergency School Closing

The Superintendent is authorized to close Summer School in the event of hazardous weather or other emergencies that threaten the safety of students, staff members, or school property. District 64 will activate the automated phone message service to call parents/guardians when a decision to cancel school is made—typically before 6:30 a.m. Due to fixed costs, refunds to parents will not be available for student absences or cancelled days resulting from weather or other unforeseen emergency.
