### LANGUAGE ARTS

#### Basic Skills – LA

GRADE 1, GRADE 2, GRADE 3

For students currently working below the grade level average. Students will practice reading comprehension, develop basic vocabulary and work on writing and spelling during individual, small group, and whole-class activities.

#### MATH

#### Basic Skills – Math

GRADE 1, GRADE 2, GRADE 3

For students currently working below the grade level average. Students will work on mathematical thinking and grade level math skills during individual, small group, and whole-class activities.

### KINDERGARTEN

#### Ready, Set, Go!

GRADE K

For soon-to-be 1st graders. Improve readiness skills, including listening and following directions. Students will work alone and in a group while focusing on their letters and numbers.

GRADES K-1

Learn about everything from ladybugs to beetles while making crafts, reading stories, and practicing math and science. For kids who love to learn about insects and have fun!

### A Star is Born

GRADES 1-3

In this musical theatre workshop, discover what it takes to produce a show from start to finish. Practice vocal and acting skills through singing exercises and theatre games. The class culminates with a set, costumes, and a live performance for families and friends. *\$6 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Around the World

GRADES 2-3

Come take a journey with us to 13 exciting places around the world. Learn some basic language and experience the food, culture and unique features of each country. *\$5 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Artsy Artists

GRADES K-1, GRADES 2-3

Create something from nothing! Use your hands and imagination to create favorite arts and crafts projects. *\$15 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Awesome Authors

GRADES 2-3

Write and publish your very own fiction book! Designed for beginning readers and writers ready to learn and have fun, too.

### Baking Buddies

GRADES 2-3

Create and sample tasty recipes; learn measurement, how to follow recipe directions, and basic kitchen safety. *\$20 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Camp Read-A-Lot

GRADES K-1, GRADES 2-3

Grade appropriate reading and writing plus fun hands-on activities. Predicting outcomes, drawing conclusions and overall comprehension skills will be reinforced.

### Construction Craze

GRADES 2-3

Boys and girls, do you like to create new structures using blocks, LEGO's and everything else around you? Create solutions to design problems. Learn what it takes to make an awesome structure! *\$20 supply fee added to class tuition*

### For the Fun of It

GRADES K-1, GRADES 2-3

"Get messy" and learn in this hands-on crafts class. Cross-curricular projects include language arts, science, and food. *\$10 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Fun with Numbers

GRADE K

Lots of fun activities to teach mathematical thinking with a focus on number sense.

### Mathemagicians

GRADE 1

Students working at or slightly above grade level will reinforce their math skills, focusing on addition and subtraction.

GRADES 2-3

Students working at or slightly above grade level will reinforce their mathematical thinking and skills in basic operations.

### Me Dolls

GRADES K-3

Make your own "Me Doll" using fabric, yarn and other notions. Storytelling plus emphasis on creating a positive self-image. Regular attendance required. For both boys and girls. (Cost of fabric and yarn not included in fee.) *\$18 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Pirates' Cove

GRADES 1-2

Yo-ho-ho and a bunch of fun! Students will enjoy a variety of pirate activities as they read, create art, and search for treasure! *\$4 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Read It & Eat It

GRADES K-1, GRADES 2-3

Experience literature through cooking. The students will hear a story, play, or poem with a food theme. Cooking activities relating to the literature provide delicious treats. *\$15 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Science ABC's

GRADES K-1, GRADES 2-3

Inquiry is the focus in this hands-on science class. Students will conduct investigations to answer engaging questions about the natural world. *\$12 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Scrapbooking

GRADES 2-3

Come with your own photos, and be ready to create a memorable book. It will be your masterpiece about you, your family and friends, holidays and seasons. *\$15 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Sign Language

GRADES 1-3

Communicate with friends without speaking. Have fun with spelling. Learn to sign letters, words, and phrases.

### Sports & Games

GRADES K-1, GRADES 2-3

Students will work on fitness, coordination, and teamwork as they play and compete in various team sports and games. Using iPads, students will also practice math, reading, and writing skills to describe their experiences and track their progress.

### Summer Times

GRADES 2-3

Learn writing and beginning editing skills while creating your own online newspaper.

### Techno-Whizzes

GRADES K-1, GRADES 2-3

Enjoy learning with laptops, iPads, and a SMART Board. Play educational games and create cool projects, too. *\$5 supply fee added to class tuition*

### Write to Read

GRADES K-1

Daily literature read alouds and journaling will inspire children to create and share their own "little books". Focused instruction includes reading and writing strategies plus spelling, grammar, and genre awareness.

## Registration Information

### Registration

Registration begins Thursday, March 2, at 10:00 a.m. and must be completed online at the District website, [www.d64.org](http://www.d64.org). Access program information and registration through the “Worlds of Wonder” link.

#### *Apply early. Many classes fill quickly!*

Priority will be given to children who reside in District 64 and enroll on or before April 15. Non-District 64 residents may not register before April 16 and must pay the increased tuition rate.

**NEW! Registration for BOTH sessions will close on Wednesday, May 31, 2017. No further registrations will be accepted after that date for either session.**

### Selecting the Proper Class

Students may enroll in a maximum of 2 classes per session. Some classes may be offered at only one class time — consult the Class Schedule Planner. **Each class has a unique Class Number based on the time and session. Note this Class Number as it will make online registration easier.**

- Look for classes that indicate the grade your child will complete by the end of the 2016-17 school year.
- Children should select a class in which they are interested and seem best qualified. If you have questions about your child’s ability, please consult with his or her current teacher. Based on your child’s needs, your child’s classroom teacher may recommend a basic skill-building class.
- **If your child has a food allergy, please consider whether a foods class would be appropriate.**
- A child who is inappropriately placed will be reevaluated by staff and possibly reassigned to a more suitable class.



### NEW! Payments and Refunds

Online payment must be made by debit or credit card (Discover, Visa, and MasterCard only). Online registrations will not be processed without full payment.

\*Additional fees may be assessed for special supplies. A \$ in the class description denotes when an additional fee is due.

We understand that plans may change prior to the start of summer school:

- **Before June 1**, tuition and any applicable supply fee will be refunded, subject to a 5% processing fee per class.
- **No refunds of any kind will be given after Wednesday, May 31.**

If District 64 cancels a class due to insufficient enrollment, tuition and any applicable supply fee will be fully refunded.

Due to fixed costs, refunds will not be available for student absences or cancelled days resulting from weather or other unforeseen emergency.

### Absences

**Parents must notify the Washington School office at (847) 653-3768 before 8:15 a.m. if their child will be absent.**

The school secretary will contact parents if an absence has not been confirmed. Vacations or a prolonged illness should be reported in advance.

### Transportation

Students may walk or be driven to school. Students who ride or use a bike, skateboard, or rollerblades must wear a helmet to and from school, according to District policy. The Park Ridge Park District provides shuttle service for students attending summer camp after class. Please refer to its brochure for details.

### Medication at School

Most medication can and should be timed to be taken at home. If it becomes necessary for your child to take or keep medication at school, a medication form must be completed by you and your child’s physician. This applies to both prescription and over-the-counter medication. The Medication Authorization Form can be found on the District website at [www.d64.org](http://www.d64.org) or can be obtained from any school health office. Medication must be provided in a labeled prescription bottle or in original packaging.

If documentation is already on file in the school health office, no further paperwork is necessary. In the case of asthma inhalers only, parent signature is required on the medication form; however, the pharmacy label from the inhaler may substitute for the physician’s signature. The label must include the student name, date, and dose and timing of medication.

- **Please note:** It is the parent/guardian’s responsibility to transport the medication from the child’s home school to summer school. Parents also must pick up all medication by the last day of summer school.

### Emergency School Closing

The Superintendent is authorized to close Summer School in the event of hazardous weather or other emergencies that threaten the safety of students, staff members, or school property. District 64 will activate the automated phone message service to call parents/guardians when a decision to cancel school is made — typically before 6:30 a.m.
