Grayslake North High School, one of two high schools in District 127, is a four-year comprehensive public high school in Lake County, which offers challenging programs for students of all ability levels. It has 10 public and private sender schools from communities within the townships of Avon, Fremont, Grant, Lake Villa and Warren. Sending districts include Grayslake, Palombi, Millburn, Woodland, and Fremont. Grayslake, a residential community, is located 50 miles northwest of Chicago.

Additional courses in English and reading will be required of students who fail to pass a District administered proficiency exam.

Students must successfully complete one year of United States History and pass tests on the Illinois and Federal Constitutions and take the Prairie State Achievement Examination, unless the student is exempt according to 105 ILCS 5/2-3.64.

One Carnegie unit of credit must be earned in art, foreign language, music and/or technical education courses. A total of 23.0 Carnegie Units are required.

In addition, no student shall receive a certificate of graduation without passing a satisfactory examination on patriotism and principles of representative government, proper use of the flag, methods of voting and the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Achievement of a passing score on a State proficiency exam in Consumer Education will exempt students from this requirement.

*Students must pass physical education every semester in which they are enrolled except in the semester they are enrolled in health or when they are exempted by Board policy.

Grade Point Average and Class Rank

Grading Scale

District 127 has adopted a standardized grading scale throughout the curriculum. The following grading scale and corresponding grades are used by all the teachers:

90 – 100 = A	60 – 69 = D
80 – 89 = B	59 & below = F
70 – 79 = C	

Grade Point Average (G.P.A.)

A student's G.P.A. is computed using semester grades. G.P.A. is determined by averaging the grades which students receive in most of their classes. Using the weighted grading system specified in the "Weighting of Grades" section, a class rank is determined for every student by grade level. All courses are figured into the G.P.A. except the following: Independent Study Courses, Correspondence Courses, Physical Education, Pass/Fail Courses, Independent Project and Work Study.
