#### Grading Scale

District 127 has a standardized grading scale. The following grading scale and corresponding grades are used by all the teachers:

**Class Rank:** District 127 is no longer publishing class rank on transcripts sent after November 15, 2015. During the transition, some student transcripts will have class rank and some will not.

**Grade Point Average (G.P.A.):** A student's G.P.A. is computed using semester grades. G.P.A. is determined by averaging the grades which students receive in most of their classes. All courses are figured into the G.P.A. except the following: Independent Study Courses, Correspondence Courses, Physical Education, Pass/Fail Courses, Independent Project and Work Study.
