- Students must successfully complete United States History, World History, Government/Civics and pass tests on the Illinois and Federal Constitutions.
- Students must demonstrate college and career readiness on a state proficiency exam.
- A total of 23 Carnegie Units are required.
- Students must pass life fitness every semester in which they are enrolled except in the semester they are enrolled in health or when they are exempted by Board Policy.
- The graduation requirements for the Class of 2020 were amended to mirror the Executive Order from the Governor of the State of Illinois reducing graduation requirements for grade 12 students in light of the Covid 19 pandemic and the suspension of in-person learning.
