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ELECTRICAL APPRENTICESHIP IN PERSON APPLICATION PROCEDURES FOR THE 2021 CLASS

The Lake County Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee will accept applications in person for both the Inside and Telecommunication Electrical Apprenticeship programs at the Electrical Training Facility, from **October 14, 2020 through January 6, 2021**. Applications will be accepted in person on **Wednesdays ONLY** from **7:00am-12:00pm and 1:00pm-4:00pm, EXCEPT for October 14th, November 11th and December 9th when applications will be accepted from 7:00am - 12:00pm and 1:00pm - 5:30pm**. Those accepted into the program may begin work in the spring of 2021.

A \$25.00 application fee must be submitted at the time of application in the form of cash or money order for in person applications, and credit card for online applications.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPRENTICESHIP

A pool of eligible applicants shall be established consisting of individuals who qualify for oral interview. To qualify for oral interview, an applicant must meet the following basic requirements by 4pm February 1, 2021, unless he or she has a minimum of four thousand hours of substantiated electrical construction work experience:

1. Must be at least 18 years of age on or before June 1, 2021
2. Must be a high school graduate, have a GED or a two-year associate degree by February 1, 2021
3. Must have completed one full year of high school algebra or one post high school algebra course of 3 credit hours or more, with a passing grade for the class
4. Must have a valid driver's license
5. Must have a qualifying score of 4 on the NJATC General Aptitude Test Battery administered by the training office **after** all other qualifying paper work has been submitted and approved.
6. Applicants selected from the pool will be required to pass a physical examination, a job related practical assessment, background check and drug screen evaluation including a hair follicle exam.
7. Must submit a DD-214 to verify military training and/or experience if applicant is a veteran.
8. Must provide proof of name change if applicable.

Individuals, who can verify by providing undisputable documenting evidence that they have worked a minimum of 4000 hours specifically in the electrical construction trade, will qualify for an oral interview by the JATC to be considered along with other qualified applicants. To qualify under this provision, applicants must complete an application form and must accurately respond to the questions below:

ALL CANDIDATES MUST ALSO BE ABLE TO COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING QUALIFICATIONS

1. Physically and mentally able to safely perform or learn to safely perform essential functions of the job either with or without reasonable accommodations.
2. Able to get to and from work at job sites anywhere within the geographical area that this apprenticeship program covers.
3. Able and willing to attend all related classroom training as required to complete their apprenticeship.
4. Able to climb and work from ladders, scaffolds, poles and towers of various heights.
5. Able to crawl and work in confined spaces such as attics, manholes and crawlspaces
6. Able to read, hear, and understand instructions and warnings.
7. Required to have use of a personal laptop running a Windows O.S. and internet access for homework and class day work.

NO LATER THAN 4:00pm February 1, 2021 to qualify for the pool of eligible applicants:**

- A. Copy of Birth Certificate or other legal document showing proof of age**
 - B. Copy of Valid Drivers License**
 - C. An official transcript of high school courses and grades, with proof of one year of algebra. Pre-algebra and modified algebra will not be considered to meet this minimum requirement. Those submitting a GED must also submit an official high school transcript from the last attended school. Transcripts must be officially sealed in an envelope from the high school with a seal or official registrar's signature on the outside of the envelope, whether mailed or presented at our office. UNOFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. If the high school transcript does not contain the required proof of a one year algebra course, then a separate official transcript must be provided to show proof of the course completion with a passing grade.**
 - D. If the high school transcript does not contain graduation information, the applicant must submit proof of graduation or GED.**

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ELECTRICAL CONSTRUCTION APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM – INSIDE WIREMAN

The Lake County Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee sponsors an electrical construction apprenticeship program in Lake County, Illinois, for the purpose of training people to become journeymen wiremen.

The apprenticeship is a five-year program, registered with the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, U.S. Department of Labor. The apprenticeship requires a minimum 200 hours of classroom training each year for five years, and 8000 hours of on-the-job training. An apprentice accepted into the program will work in Lake County, Illinois, for Electrical Contractors specified by the training Committee.

The training program is jointly sponsored by the Lake County Division, Northeastern Illinois Chapter of the National Electrical Contractors Association, and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local Union #150.

The apprentices in the program will attend day school at a predetermined time, throughout the year, and work for an electrical contractor on the other days of the week. The starting pay for an apprentice is approximately \$16.82 per hour, and the apprentices will receive raises at specified times throughout the 5-year program. A person will become a journeyman wireman in I.B.E.W. Local Union #150 upon graduation from the apprenticeship program. The journeyman pay rate is approximately \$42.05 per hour.

The apprentice learns the manual skills associated with the trade under the direct supervision of a journeyman wireman. The training in the field might include the mounting of equipment and electrical boxes, the bending and installation of electrical conduit, the pulling and termination of wire and cable, and the wiring of switches, receptacles, and lighting fixtures in residential, commercial, and industrial occupancies. Specialized installations can include the control of motors, heating, ventilating, and air conditioning equipment, traffic signal, fiber optics, and computer equipment.

The apprentice studies such subjects as mathematics, electrical theory, blueprint reading, National Electrical Code, nuclear energy, semiconductor devices, and the control of motors and generators in school. Classes are held at our own training facility in Lake County.

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TELECOMMUNICATION & DATA APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

The Lake County Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee sponsor an telecommunication and data apprenticeship program in Lake County, Illinois, for the purpose of training people to become journeymen sound and communication technicians.

The apprenticeship is a four year program registered with the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, U.S. Department of Labor. The apprenticeship requires a minimum 200 hours of classroom training each year for four years, and 6400 hours of on-the-job training. An apprentice accepted into the program will work in Lake County, Illinois, for sound & communication contractors specified by the training Committee.

The training program is jointly sponsored by the Lake County Division, Northeastern Illinois Chapter of the National Electrical Contractors Association, and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local Union #150.

The apprentices in the program go to school two evenings a week, three hours each evening, from September to June, and work for a sound & communication contractor during the day. The starting pay for an apprentice is approximately \$17.55 per hour, and the apprentices will receive raises at specified times throughout the 4 year program. A person will become a journeyman sound and communication technician in I.B.E.W. Local Union #150 upon graduation from the apprenticeship program. The journeyman pay rate is approximately \$39.00 per hour.

The apprentice learns the manual skills associated with the trade under the direct supervision of a journeyman sound and communication technician. The training in the field might include low voltage communication cabling, sound and data cabling, fiber optics, and security alarms in residential, commercial, and industrial occupancies.

The apprentice studies such subjects as mathematics, electrical theory, blueprint reading, and National Electrical Code, telecommunication and data systems in evening school.
