Grading Scale

District 127 has a standardized grading scale. The following grading scale and corresponding grades are used by all the teachers:

90–100 = A	60–69 = D
80–89 = B	59 & below = F
70–79 = C	

Class Rank: District 127 is no longer publishing class rank on transcripts sent after November 15, 2015. During the transition, some student transcripts will have class rank and some will not.

Grade Point Average (G.P.A.): A student's G.P.A. is computed using semester grades. G.P.A. is determined by averaging the grades which students receive in most of their classes. All courses are figured into the G.P.A. except the following: Independent Study Courses, Correspondence Courses, Physical Education, Pass/Fail Courses, Independent Project and Work Study.
