- Each student will receive the latest iPad model covered by a three year AppleCare+ warranty.
- Each student will also get a license for an electronic portfolio (Chalk and Wire)
- All paid apps needed for class are provided free of charge.
- Access to color and grayscale printers, scanners, video and still cameras, tripods, professional microphones, and more.

How will it be paid for?

During the first eligible semester each student receiving an iPad will be billed a technology fee to cover the cost of the iPad and warranty. This cost will vary from year to year but has been set at \$700.00 for the 2015-16 school year. During this year, the normal annual technology fee (\$110.00) will be waived although you will still receive all of the benefits provided by that fee.

Who owns the iPad?

You do. The moment you pick up your iPad it becomes your property and responsibility.

How will this impact my courses?

iPad use in classes will vary depending on the individual faculty member and the course. Faculty in the Edmund J. Gleazer School of Education are already planning to use iPads in at least one task in their classes. It is critical for your success to bring your iPad and its available resources to class each day. Faculty members will set policy on class requirements.

Will I have to buy apps in addition to textbooks?

NO. Apps required for your classes will be provided by the Edmund J. Gleazer School of Education at no charge. At the end of the course you can decide if you want to purchase the app to keep.

How will I purchase apps for my iPad?

You will need to create an Apple ID. You will not need a credit card to create the ID, but you will need one to make any purchases.
