

First graders started working on the curriculum this week! We are reading *Stellaluna* and practicing our addition skills! Scan the QR code to hear about reading.





Social Emotional Learning


Students are spending all day on their computers, so we have been learning about internet safety and how to make good choices online.

Animals and plants alike generally need to take in air and water, animals must take in food, and plants need light and minerals.
