Planning for 2021-22

- Updated guidance from <u>ISBE and IDPH</u> on March 9, 2021
 - K-12 schools should be the last settings to close after all other mitigation measures in the community have been employed and the first to reopen when they can do so safely. This implies that schools should be prioritized for reopening and remaining open for in-person instruction over nonessential business and activities - CDC

Within 30 days of receiving the funds, make publicly available on its website a plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services. Before making the plan publicly available, the LEA must seek public comment on the plan. Additionally, 20% of funds must be reserved for evidence based learning loss initiatives.
