On The Way

On the Way: Catholic Social Doctrine; Solidarity

The human person is by his very nature a social being. From this truth comes the principle of *solidarity*: the awareness of our common human nature and shared responsibility to one another – what used to be called the "brotherhood of man." Our common human nature binds us to one another in a manner that transcends our economic, racial, ethnic, and national identities. We all share the human condition.

Terence, the ancient Roman playwright and former slave, famously wrote, "I am a man; I regard nothing human as alien to me." That is a great summary of solidarity. Because we are all human, we cannot regard anyone or any group as so distant or far off as to be of no concern to us.

In 1939, in the face of Nazi racism, Pope Pius XII lamented the "disregard for the law of human solidarity and charity." That law or principle, he said, is "dictated and imposed both by our common origin and by the equality in rational nature of all men, whatever nation they belong to" (CCC 1939). If we do not appreciate the reality of our shared human nature (as the Nazis did not), then we will fail to appreciate solidarity and our responsibility to one another.

It is natural for us to gravitate to those similar to us in terms of ethnicity, economics, religion, etc. But in considering the good of society as a whole, we cannot remain concerned only about our own kind. Poland's Solidarity movement bore that name because it was composed of not just one group or another but a broad cross section of Polish society. The power of Solidarity's, well... *solidarity* was revealed in the fall of the Soviet Union. By refusing to limit itself to this group or that, Solidarity presented a united front to the Soviets that proved to be their undoing.

Related to solidarity is the principle of the common good. "By common good is to be understood 'the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily.' The common good concerns the life of all" (CCC 1906).

Notice again the importance of the truth of the human person. To shape those "social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily," we must know what the human person is and what constitutes his fulfilment. A mistake about the nature of the human person inevitably leads – as history has continuously shown – to a disordered and ultimately violent society.

For example, serving the common good requires a concern for economics. But the human person needs more than money for fulfillment. Thus, serving the common good means shaping laws and a society in keeping with the deeper, spiritual truths of the human person. It means laws that promote the family and respect for life. This is the grave error of Marxism (in forms both past and present): it reduces the human person to just a material entity and thus builds a society hostile to him. - Father Scalia

Holy Communion During the Pandemic

As many of you know, since the beginning of the pandemic we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. But as more people return to Mass it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- We have placed Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross *farthest* from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross and the minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host. Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.
- Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.
