## From Our Pastor

---



Why is it that people devour tabloids and talk shows that reveal the deviant behaviors of others, especially celebrities and politicians, yet get upset when a priest gives a sermon on sin? As a society, we cannot get enough dirt on a person; nothing is out of bounds. We laugh saying, “[I]f you don’t have anything nice to say about someone come sit by me.” Yet, when it comes to acknowledging our own failures, we turn a deaf ear to the conversation. Employers say that one of the most difficult tasks they have is to address an issue with an employee; no one ever takes it well. On the contrary, they can often become defensive after disciplinary action. But it is precisely this type of

mentoring which we all need: helping someone see their shortcomings in order to become a better worker, co-worker and person. It is the same with our faith development; we need to examine our conscience in light of the Commandments and teachings of the Church, to discipline ourselves, in order to stay on the right path.

Jesus wants the best from us; He will not accept mediocrity from us. Jesus expects us to avoid things which hinder our development as faithful Christian witnesses. When we are given the way to heaven, is it a wonder that Jesus uses such harsh language in today’s Gospel? *“Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life maimed than with two hands to go to Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire.”* This is of course, a metaphor; Jesus does not want us to harm ourselves. He speaks this way to stress the seriousness of sin. The commandments are our guide; yet so many not only get lost but fail to use it at all.

Jesus warns us not to fall prey to Satan, who prowls about looking to enter into our minds and hearts. We need to be conscious of our sinfulness, open to good advice and counsel from family and friends, and willing to grow into a more mature follower of Jesus. Will you join the Psalmist’s refrain, *“The precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart?”*

I invite you to read pages 5-8 which has important parish financial information. Thank you for the many blessings you bestow on our wonderful parish.

## *St. James Stewardship Report, September 2015*

My Dear Parishioners,



Within this communication you will find our financial statement submitted to the Diocese, which shows a modest increase of 2.5% in our collections. You will also find a synopsis of the programs and people who benefit from your generosity. For your financial and spiritual support, I thank you. Your commitment recognizes that “all gifts come from God,” as our Patron Saint says. Our great responsibility (*all of us*) is to be good stewards of the material blessings received. Yes, we must pay utility bills; yes, we must pay maintenance and salaries. Yet, we are more than a business model. We are “laborers in the vineyard,” opening our doors to new initiatives and in so doing planting seeds in the hope of bringing others to Christ. Your gifts enable us to “live the vision.” With your help we can continue to do this, and more. With your help we can be more than just a gentle ripple in the pond; we can spread the waters of Baptism. And so I ask you again to be generous, as you have always been. The need for the witness of our faith is great, perhaps now more than ever.

Please review the enclosed commitment card; you may drop it in the offertory basket or mail to the rectory. For all your sacrifices, may God bless you. – Father Posey



Dear Parishioners,

I would like to echo Father Posey’s appreciation for your sustained commitment to St. James. Under his leadership and guidance we have successfully managed a budget of over \$5 million. I thank him, Sister Mary Sue and Sr. Regina Rosarii for stewarding the Parish’s and School’s resources in such a sound financial manner. You will see from our financial statement that we have managed a modest increase (2.5%) in Offertory giving over fiscal 2014. While this is certainly beneficial, it is important that we continue to see sustained growth in your support in order to build a fund reserve for capital improvements. For example, replacement and repair of the Church air conditioning units and the school/convent retaining walls this summer was in excess of \$100,000, paid from our Legacy campaign funds, which are now over 90% spent. Compare this with the modest \$44,739 surplus generated by operations (less than 1% of revenues) and you can understand the importance of forward momentum to meet our needs in the New Year and beyond.

My thanks to my fellow Finance Council members Brian O’Connor, John Gallagher, Tom Kuehne and Maureen Quattrocki for their dedication; I would also like to thank our Business Manager Rich Blickendorfer and Finance Manager Beth Banasik for their hard work and commitment to fiscal prudence.

I encourage everyone to consider Father Posey’s request for an increase in their weekly offertory gifts; your help is key to continuing our tradition of service. Thank you for your support and prayers.
