From Our Pastor



"Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid." (Matthew 1:20)

Perhaps your Christmas tree is up by now; maybe you struggled and defeated the tangle of lights you swore you would store more neatly last year; maybe you're just about finished with shopping for gifts and addressing cards. All in anticipation of a joyful celebration next week. Hopefully you've taken advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in order to receive our Savior in the spirit of renewal, hope and promise. YOU are prepared (or almost) for Christmas. You know what's coming.

Joseph, on the other hand, was most assuredly not prepared to find his young fiancée already pregnant before their marriage. It is easy to slide past today's Gospel, so accustomed are we to hearing of Joseph's "easy" acquiescence to God's commands. Just as it's easy to assume his "yes," it is also easy to forget that he was a human being. Place yourself in his position: most likely older, and a man, in a society where lineage played such an important cultural role. It is this ancestry which the gospel writer takes pains to establish in this chapter. We cannot and should not gloss over the fact that Joseph's reaction mirrors Mary's to Gabriel: fear and confusion. It is no accident that the first words the angel says to both of them are "do not be afraid." What links Joseph and Mary even before the birth of Christ are hearts open to God's word. They trusted their own faith, a faith which did in fact prepare them both to say "yes."

In our own lives, we too will be tested, our assumptions turned on their heads, our plans set awry. What will be our reaction to unexpected detours? How will we face disappointment, illness, loss? How will we handle assignments which we feel we cannot do? Fear is sometimes an appropriate response; it serves to protect us from harm; it serves as a reminder to plan. Fear is understandable, but it should not hold you captive from trust. Joseph and Mary were rightly afraid: not yet married and, oh by the way, you'll be parents to the Son of God. Again, what drove them to move ahead was a trust that God would not abandon them. This didn't mean the road would be easy (and it definitely was not), but the path was eased by faith. God will not abandon us either: through job losses, marital issues, illness, painful relationships, and even death. Say yes to Him. Welcome Him into your hearts not just next Sunday but every day. And remember, do not be afraid because "God is with us."

For those who will not be able to join us physically at Christmas Mass, the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception will be sharing their services on their YouTube channel.
