2017-2018 PROFILE

Monroe Township is a Bicentennial Community, with its first residents predating 1776. Located in the Delaware Valley in the northeast corner of Gloucester County, Monroe Township has matured into a rapidly growing suburban community of approximately 36,000 residents. Major cities in the area include Philadelphia, 20 miles; Atlantic City, 40 miles; and New York City, 100 miles.

Established in 1958, Williamstown High School is a four-year comprehensive high school with a focus on academic excellence. Its mission is to provide an atmosphere where students become responsible, productive citizens, and life-long learners. For the 2016-2017 school year our students chose programs from over 200 course offerings, including courses from our Academies in Allied Health, Business and Finance, Computer Science, Engineering, Law and Justice, and Teacher Academy as well as our Air Force Junior ROTC program. WHS has 160 certified faculty members. The faculty serves as catalysts for academic and personal success for all students.

Williamstown High School has an active site council comprised of stakeholders representing the school community. The group provides school improvement in the areas of program, facility, climate, and parental involvement as permitted by law and by policy of the Board of Education. Using data based research and collaboration, the council meets on a regular basis to address issues, discuss suggestions, and research resolutions by consensus.

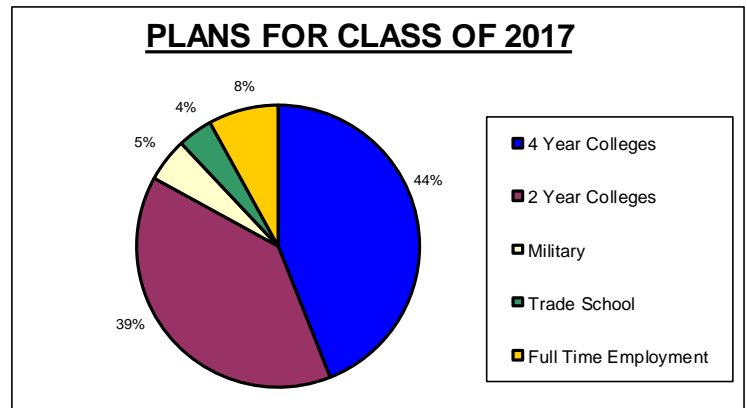
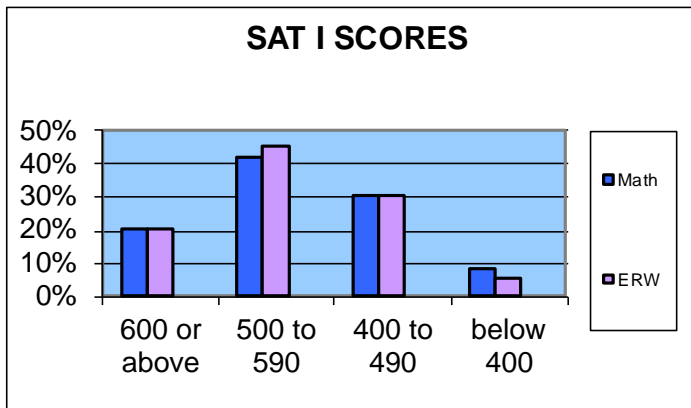
GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The school presents a fall drama production and a spring musical every year as well as a program highlighting the music, dance, and drama programs for Achievement Night.
