- 9-5. Institute a knowledgeable attitude about conception, birth control, abortion and venereal disease.
- 9-6. Understand that sexuality involves more than the physical aspects of sex. It also involves emotions, feelings and judgments.
- 9-7. Understand that:
  - A. Cultural and family values, standards and attitudes influence the selection of a marriage partner.
  - B. Value factors contribute to the success or failure of marriages.
  - C. Knowledge and appreciation of conception, embryological development, prenatal and postnatal problems and the birth process are shared responsibilities.

- 12-8. Develop an understanding of the difference between love and infatuation.
- 12-9. Develop an understanding of the various factors that contribute to the success or failure of marriage.
- 12-10. Develop an understanding of the process of planning for a wedding.
- 12-11. Develop a workable philosophy of life (as a couple) and understand how it gives unity to a marriage.
- 12-12. Identify family values, goals and standards and their relationships to family harmony and quality of family life.
- 12.13. Analyze the different functions that are the responsibilities of the family and its members.
- 12.14. Develop awareness in planning and budgeting.
- 12-15. List and discuss the responsibilities of parenthood.
- 12-16. Develop an understanding that a good parent has an appreciation of the children's needs.
- 12-17. Display their ability to make decisions by responding to each of the cases presented in the "cases for discussions" handout.
