The end of the first quarter of the 2016-17 is nearly upon us and it has been a busy nine weeks indeed.

Our enrollment has surpassed the 1540 student mark and is the largest enrollment ever at Kimberly High School. With our increasing enrollment we have worked through a number of challenges but have worked diligently to make sure every student has an opportunity to develop positive connections with our teachers and staff. These opportunities exist in many different ways beyond the classroom. It is rewarding to see the number of students participating in Life Force, Key Club, DECA, and Art Cub (just to name a few). Some of lesser known clubs like Comics@KHS and LARP (Live Action Role Play) have also drawn a nice number of students. Students are still able to join most of our clubs and organizations. Likewise, the number of students involved in athletics, music and theatre have also been on the rise and opportunities for participation still exist. Check in with our school counselors or check the announcements for more details.

On a more serious note, recent national trends in school violence has caused many districts to review their safety processes. While a serious event is exceptionally rare, we still want to be as prepared as possible should something occur. Because of what we have learned from other districts around the nation, we are changing our "active intruder" protocol from "lock down" to "run, hide, fight." "Run, hide, fight" is a protocol recommended by the Department of Homeland Security to promote decision-making in an active intruder situation.

For this reason, the district and Fox Valley Metro Police will be conducting a violent intruder simulation at Kimberly High School and JR Gerritts Middle School on Thursday, October 27, 2016. During the training, these two schools will be completely inaccessible to anyone not directly participating in the simulation: Kimberly High School (12:00-2:30pm, offices remained closed for the day) and JR Gerritts Middle School (1:45-4:00pm). Our goal is to provide our staff with training needed to react in a situation so they can do their best to provide a safe environment for students.

Enjoy the opportunities the fall season brings.



### **Papermaker Writing Center**



Dear Kimberly High School Parent or Guardian,

Beginning in the 14-15 school year, the state of Wisconsin introduced a number of changes to the state's student assessment system. Since that time, those changes have remained consistent and include:

- Aspire Early High School Assessment grades nine and ten
- ACT and WorkKeys grade eleven
- Forward Social Studies assessment grade ten

The ACT Early High School Assessment will cover five subject areas for students in grades nine and ten: Reading, Math, Writing, Language Arts and Science. The tests will be computer-delivered and will be spread out over multiple days. Students in grade nine will test during their English classes the weeks of April 24 and May 1. Students in grade ten will test on April 25 & 26 during a modified school schedule. In addition, students in grade ten will take the Wisconsin Forward Exam, a Social Studies-only test that will be administered by computer on Wednesday, April 26.

In addition, for the third year, every junior in the state of Wisconsin is required to take the ACT and Work Keys assessments. This year those tests will be held on February 28 and March 1. All juniors will report those dates during a modified school schedule.

Please note the modified school schedules listed on the next pages.

Additional information about the ACT Early High School and Forward assessments will be shared as they become available.

# What are the ACT High School

# Assessments?

ACT®, Inc. has provided testing services for more than 50 years and their assessments have evolved over the years to reflect the nation's view of education to embrace lifelong learning and prepare students to be college and career ready after high school graduation. The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) entered into a partnership with ACT®, Inc. during the 2014-15 fiscal year to comprehensively assess Wisconsin high school students:

- 9th and 10th grade students will take the ACT Aspire "Early High School assessment in the Spring.
- 11th grade students will take The ACT® Plus Writing and the ACT® WorkKeys® Assessment System in the Spring.

# The ACT Aspire™ Early High School - ACT Aspire assesses student readiness in English, mathematics, reading, science, and writing.

The ACT® Plus Writing - The ACT Plus Writing consists of four multiple-choice tests: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science; and a 40-minute essay test that measures student writing skills.

ACT® WorkKeys® - ACT WorkKeys is an applied skills assessment system which consists of 3 tests: Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information.

# How are the test results used?

All students in grades 9-11 will be given these assessments except for approximately 1% of students with significant cognitive disabilities who will be tested with an alternate assessment. This system of assessments will allow teachers to measure a student's growth throughout high school.

DPI will also use The ACT® Plus Writing for the high school accountability measure in order to determine the extent to which schools and districts across the state meet proficiency standards.

# What type of scores will be provided?

- ACT Aspire™ Early High School scores are reported on a 3 digit scale. These scores will predict future ACT scores and WorkKeys National Career Readiness Certificate attainment.
- ACT scores range from 1 to 36 for each of the subtests and one overall score called a test composite. Students will also receive a writing score ranging from 2 to 12. In most situations scores earned on the ACT can be used by students for college enrollment, scholarships, and NCAA eligibility requirements. Many UW System colleges require ACT scores for college entrance.
- By taking the WorkKeys assessment, students can earn National Career Readiness Certificates (NCRC) that are recognized nationally by businesses and industries. This certificate is used by some employers

to make sure prospective employees have the skills necessary for the job they are applying for. Students will demonstrate their skills in the areas of Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information.

 Score reports will be available 4-6 weeks after each assessment is given.

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



### IF YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter



In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation



Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

### Your eligible children have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is your preference and is feasible.
  - \* If the school district believes that the school you select is not in the best interest of your children, then the district must provide you with a written explanation of its position and inform you of your right to appeal its decision.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if you request this.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to your children's needs.

If you believe your children may be eligible, contact the local liaison to find out what services and supports may be available. There also may be supports available for your preschool-age children.

### Family Move - Outside of the Kimberly Area School District

When a family moves outside of the Kimberly Area School District, students may continue to attend the school where they are currently enrolled if they qualify for a Tuition Waiver (obtained from the district office). Students who qualify for a Tuition Waiver are entitled to continue their enrollment through the waiver period. However, they are required to apply for Open Enrollment during the next Open Enrollment application period if they want to remain in the Kimberly Area School District after the Tuition Waiver has expired.

### Family Move - Within the Kimberly Area School District

When a family move occurs within the Kimberly Area School District, students may continue to attend the school where they are currently enrolled even though their residence has changed to another Kimberly Area School District attendance area.

Parents who wish to have their student(s) remain in the same school after a move within the school district, must complete the Attendance Exception Form located on the district website, under Parents—Attendance Area and return it to the district office Attn: Sara Vogel

Emergency Medications: Please be aware that emergency medications that are provided for use during the school day will not be accessible before or after school hours. Parents and students must plan ahead to have emergency medication

available during school activities such as clubs and sports. If an emergency arises and a student does not have their emergency medication available, 911
