At Kimberly High School January brings not only the opportunities of a new calendar year but later this month the start of a new semester. Every student will have a different schedule with different courses and new teachers. This is a great time to reflect on the successes and challenges of the first semester and to make a resolution to sustain or improve academically as the new semester begins. Likewise, our teachers are looking forward to meeting new classes of students and to begin the process of creating a positive learning environment in their second semester classes.

This is also the time we begin the process of course selection for the 2017-18 school year. Again, we anticipate an enrollment increase so classes tend to fill and making schedule changes in fall may be difficult. So, please take some time to look at all of the course offerings and opportunities we offer and remember that a well-balanced selection of courses is always a great choice.

I think it is also important that I share some of the details from the KHS Graduate Survey that was shared with our School Board at their last meeting.

Data from 2012 through 2016 graduates shows:

- 53.05% enroll in a 4 year college after graduation
- 20.39% enroll in a 2 year college (Fox Valley Tech or UW Fox Valley)
- 26.57% choose not to immediately enroll in school
- 4.5% join the military

Data from our 2009 to 2012 graduates shows the following post-high school graduation rates (1, 2, 4 or higher level program completion as of 12/1/16)

- Class of 2009 (314 grads) 63.74% of 262 students who started a program completed
- Class of 2010 (302 grads) 68.08% of 260 students who started a program completed
- Class of 2011 (300 grads) 59.68% of 253 students who started a program completed
- Class of 2012 (356 grads) 48.03% of 304 students who started a program completed

As we continue to work toward the implementation of the Academic and Career Plan for next year some of our focus areas will include:

- Identify and Communicate Readiness Indicators
 - **College Ready Indicators**
 - Career Ready Indicators
 - Life Ready Indicators
- Creating new business and college partnerships
- Developing a mentoring and advisement plan for our students

I look forward to the opportunities a new semester brings!

CAPP Cooperative • Academic • Partnership • Program



A representative from the UW-Oshkosh Testing Center will be at KHS on Wednesday, January, 25th to give the Math Placement Test. The test will be given at 7:30 am in the LGI. Any student who has completed Math 3 and plans on taking CAPP Precalculus this year or next year for college credit may take the Math Placement Test. To sign up for the Math Placement Test, bring \$5 to the KHS Main Office by Friday, January 20th.

2nd Semester CAPP Precalculus Students:

If you are planning to take CAPP Precalculus for college credit and have not completed the CAPP Admission Application online, you must complete this by **Friday**, **January 6th**, **2017**. Instructions for completing the online application at https://www.uwosh.edu/capp/students/first-apply-then-register

Students will receive an email with their student information prior to the beginning of the semester. This email is initiated by the CAPP Office as a mass message, and will likely be sent the second week of January. **Students must apply <u>before</u> Friday, January 6, or they will not receive their student information.** Without your student information you will not be able to register for college credit once you start the class January 23rd.

If you are planning to take CAPP Precalculus for college credit, you must also meet the minimum scores on the UW Math Placement Test. This should be done by the **end of January**. A representative from UW-Oshkosh will be here on **Wednesday**, **January 25**th **at 7:30am** to administer the test. The cost of the test is \$5. See the January newsletter for sign-up details. You may stop in Student Services to get a review packet.

Students may retake the Math Placement Test only three times. There must be a 7 day wait between attempts.

If you would like to take the Math Placement Test before January 25th, you may go to UW-Oshkosh to take it. Be sure to tell them you are from Kimberly HS, so that the scores get sent to us.

contact your school's secretary to update the portal.

Announcements are also sent to local T.V. and radio stations, please tune to local stations such as these rather than call the school directly: WAPL-105.7FM, WHBY-1150AM, WKFX-104.9FM, WEMI-91.9 FM, WGEE-1360 AM, and WOZZ-93.5FM; and WBAY-TV2, WFRV-TV5, WGBA-TV26, and WLUK-FOX11. If other school events, such as concerts or sporting events are also cancelled because of weather, they are typically communicated through these stations as well.

The District's website and Facebook page are not our primary way to communicate school closures, so we ask parents to listen to the auto-call messages or tune in to the radio and T.V. stations listed for the timeliest updates.

Center is available daily during block 3 and Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7:00—8:30 pm.







Exploring the theatrical styles of both Naturalism and Theatre of Cruelty, the KHS Honors Theatre Production class presents a fresh interpretation of this classic play. Having fathered an illegitimate child with his lover Marie, feckless soldier Franz Woyzeck takes odd jobs around his small town to provide some extra money for them. One of these is volunteering for experiments conducted by a local doctor, who puts Woyzeck on a diet of peas; this serves to drive him to the brink of madness, and the discovery that Marie is conducting an affair with the local drum major exacerbates the situation. Pushed too far, Woyzeck resorts to violence.

Based on the true story of Johann Christian Woyzeck, a lowly soldier in Leipzig, Germany, this remains one of the most enigmatic and influential works of modern theatre. The exploration of the dehumanizing tests Woyzeck was put through to determine if he should be held responsible for his actions, and the implications of these tests, provide the impetus of Buchner's episodic and radically innovative play.



Dear Kimberly High School Parent or Guardian,

Beginning in the 14-15 school year, the state of Wisconsin introduced a number of changes to the state's student assessment system. Since that time, those changes have remained consistent and include:

- Aspire Early High School Assessment grades nine and ten
- ACT and WorkKeys grade eleven
- Forward Social Studies assessment grade ten

The ACT Early High School Assessment will cover five subject areas for students in grades nine and ten: Reading, Math, Writing, Language Arts and Science. The tests will be computer-delivered and will be spread out over multiple days. Students in grade nine will test during their English classes the weeks of April 24 and May 1. Students in grade ten will test on April 25 & 26 during a modified school schedule. In addition, students in grade ten will take the Wisconsin Forward Exam, a Social Studies-only test that will be administered by computer on Wednesday, April 26.

In addition, for the third year, every junior in the state of Wisconsin is required to take the ACT and Work Keys assessments. This year those tests will be held on February 28 and March 1. All juniors will report those dates during a modified school schedule.

Additional information about the ACT Early High School and Forward assessments will be shared as they become available.

What are the ACT High School

Assessments?

ACT®, Inc. has provided testing services for more than 50 years and their assessments have evolved over the years to reflect the nation's view of education to embrace lifelong learning and prepare students to be college and career ready after high school graduation. The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) entered into a partnership with ACT®, Inc. during the 2014-15 fiscal year to comprehensively assess Wisconsin high school students:

- 9th and 10th grade students will take the ACT Aspire™ Early High School assessment in the Spring.
- 11th grade students will take The ACT® Plus Writing and the ACT® WorkKeys® Assessment System in the Spring.

The ACT Aspire" Early High School - ACT Aspire assesses student readiness in English, mathematics, reading, science, and writing.

The ACT® Plus Writing - The ACT Plus Writing consists of four multiple-choice tests: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science; and a 40-minute essay test that measures student writing skills.

ACT® WorkKeys® - ACT WorkKeys is an applied skills assessment system which consists of 3 tests: Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information.

How are the test results used?

All students in grades 9-11 will be given these assessments except for approximately 1% of students with significant cognitive disabilities who will be tested with an alternate assessment. This system of assessments will allow teachers to measure a student's growth throughout high school.

DPI will also use The ACT® Plus Writing for the high school accountability measure in order to determine the extent to which schools and districts across the state meet proficiency standards.

What type of scores will be provided?

- ACT Aspire™ Early High School scores are reported on a 3 digit scale. These scores will predict future ACT scores and WorkKeys National Career Readiness Certificate attainment.
- each of the subtests and one overall score called a test composite. Students will also receive a writing score ranging from 2 to 12. In most situations scores earned on the ACT can be used by students for college enrollment, scholarships, and NCAA eligibility requirements. Many UW System colleges require ACT scores for college entrance.
- By taking the WorkKeys assessment, students can earn National Career Readiness Certificates (NCRC) that are recognized nationally by businesses and industries. This certificate is used by some employers

to make sure prospective employees have the skills necessary for the job they are applying for. Students will demonstrate their skills in the areas of Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information.

 Score reports will be available 4-6 weeks after each assessment is given.

Family Move - Outside of the Kimberly Area School District

When a family moves outside of the Kimberly Area School District, students may continue to attend the school where they are currently enrolled if they qualify for a Tuition Waiver (obtained from the district office). Students who qualify for a Tuition Waiver are entitled to continue their enrollment through the waiver period. However, they are required to apply for Open Enrollment during the next Open Enrollment application period if they want to remain in the Kimberly Area School District after the Tuition Waiver has expired.

Family Move - Within the Kimberly Area School District

When a family move occurs within the Kimberly Area School District, students may continue to attend the school where they are currently enrolled even though their residence has changed to another Kimberly Area School District attendance area.

Parents who wish to have their student(s) remain in the same school after a move within the school district, must complete the Attendance Exception Form located on the district website, under Parents→Attendance Area and return it to the district office Attn: Sara Vogel

Emergency Medications: Please be aware that emergency medications that are provided for use during the school day will not be accessible before or after school hours. Parents and students must plan ahead to have emergency medication available during school activities such as clubs and sports. If an emergency arises and a student does not have their emergency medication available, 911 will be called.
