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## **Attention sophomores and juniors:**

In an effort to increase our attendance rates, we are rewarding students who have excellent attendance with the privilege to leave campus during the 2017-2018 school year.

Your eligibility for open campus during the 1st quarter of next year will be based upon your attendance during the 4th quarter of this school year.

Eligibility requirements for open campus for the 2017-2018 school year:

- 1. Must be a junior or senior.
- 2. Must have 12 or fewer <u>total periods</u> marked as "unexcused" and/or "tardy/late" during the 4th quarter of the 2016-2017 school year.

### **Key points to remember:**

- 1. If you are more than 10 minutes late to a class, it is marked as an unexcused absence.
- 2. If you have an excuse for being tardy, you must either show the excuse note to the teacher when entering class or show the attendance office who will give you an "excused" admit slip.
- 3. If you believe a teacher made a mistake in marking you absent or tardy, you are responsible for talking with the teacher to get a signed note, which you take to the attendance office for clearance.
