Wenatchee School District is joining with the Washington State Office of the Superintendent of Public Education and schools all around the state to share the news about the importance of student attendance. September is attendance awareness month

### Good school attendance means...

- Elementary students read well by the end of 3rd grade
- Middle schoolers pass important courses
- High Schoolers stay on track for graduation

We are making a special effort to ensure that all our students fully benefit from their education by attending school regularly. School attendance has a direct impact on academic achievement. Excused and/or unexcused absences can cause children to fall behind in school. This year we'll be sending home letters if a student misses more than the typical student absence rate in our school and the district so you can be aware of absenteeism and help make sure your student returns to good attendance.

### Did you know?

- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) increases the chance that your student will not read or master math at the same level as their peers.
- Children who miss too many days in kindergarten and 1st grade can struggle academically in later years. They often have trouble mastering reading by the end of 3rd grade.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.

## Back to School: First Day of School is Wednesday August 30, 2017



- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.
- It doesn't matter if these absences are excused or unexcused. They all represent lost time in the classroom and a lost opportunity to learn.

There are many people in our schools prepared to help you if you or your student face challenges in getting to school regularly or on time. Contact your child's Principal, Assistant Principal, or Counselor if you have questions or need assistance.

## Board Considers Construction Bond to Renovate Wenatchee High School

The Wenatchee School Board is considering asking voters to approve a construction bond in February, 2018 to renovate Wenatchee High School (WHS).

A modernization plan for the high school was developed in 2016/2017 by a facilities committee made up of community members and district staff, and shared with the public. Afterwards the district surveyed the community about the plan and discovered that people were concerned about the impact to student learning during construction. The plan would have required moving students into portable classrooms while classroom along the Miller Street side of WHS were torn down and rebuilt into a new two-story wing.

The district went back to the drawing board and came up with an alternative solution which wouldn't displace students during construction. The new plan includes

construction of a three-story classroom wing to the southwest of WHS, behind the gymnasium while classes continue in the existing school uninterrupted. After completion, students would move into the new wing and the old classrooms along Miller Street would be renovated.

The project cost is estimated to be about \$154 million. The State would fund \$31 million in matching funds; there is \$3 million left over in funds from the Phase 1 bond which are available for Phase II (Phase I built the new Washington Elementary and renovated Lincoln Elementary and Pioneer's locker rooms and bleachers). Voters would be asked to approve bonds to fund the balance of \$120 million. The estimated bond tax rate increase will be \$1.08 per \$1,000 assessed value.

Details of the Phase II Bond will be coming soon.

## Meals at School

Hot breakfast and lunch are available daily at every school. Our goal is to provide nutritious meals to each student in order to support their growth and development and promote an optimal classroom experience. Research has shown that hungry children often have difficulty focusing and performing to their best ability during the school day. In order to support our community and all the families in our district in meeting the shared goal to feed every kid, we offer the opportunity for families to apply to receive free or reduced-price meals.

Meals offered at the free or reduced price are the same as those offered to students who pay full-price. Additionally, the identity of students who receive these services is kept confidential. Eligibility for Free or Reduced Meals is based on income and family size. Students who were eligible in the 2016/2017 school year will remain eligible until October 11, 2017. Those students will need to re-apply on or before October 11 in order to continue their services.

New applications can be picked up from the Wenatchee School District Nutrition Services Department as early as August 1. Completed applications can be hand-delivered or mailed to the same office at the address listed below. Applications will also be available at your student’s school office

once the office re-opens for the school year, and a copy will be included in your child’s Back-To-School packet.

If you would like to load money on your student’s lunch account, you may do so through the district website as early as August 15. We look forward to providing nutritious and delicious meals to all students in Wenatchee School District for the 2017/2018 school year.

## Washington Elementary Student/ Inventor Blake Oeck Wins State, Competes Nationally

Soon-to-be 5th grader Blake Oeck of Washington Elementary represented Washington State at the National Invention Competition and Entrepreneurship Expo (NICEE) June 1-3rd near Washington, D.C. The convention was held at the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office in Alexandria, Virginia, and about 300 K-12 students competed at the event. Blake earned a berth in the national event after winning Best of Show at the the 2017 Invent Washington State Competition on May 13 in Spokane with his invention, “Germinator” which automatically kills germs in toilets and prevents the spread of disease.

Invent Washington is a program for Highly Capable (HiCap) students, where students learn to think like inventors through the design process. HiCap teachers are Brooke McCallister, Katie Stefanides, Kathy Moody, and Leslie Kiick.

Tech Center Fire Science students swept state competition in SkillsUSA Championships with senior Ryan Thompson taking gold, junior Tyler Bertram taking silver, and senior Kenneth Sebek taking bronze in the Fire Science Competition in Yakima on April 29, 2017. The win at State qualified Ryan Thompson to compete nationally.

Ryan went on to win 2nd place in National Competition in Louisville, Kentucky June 19-23, 2017. Ryan traveled to Louisville where he competed against 27 fire science students from around the nation, the US Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and the Navajo Nation.

Ryan said he attributes his success to practice, practice, practice. “I was in Chief Blanchard’s summer school

program for four years and this is my second year in the year-long class,” he said.

The Firefighting competition involves a 100 question written test, an oral interview and CPAT test which evaluates hands-on skills, including handling fire hoses, ladders, ropes, breathing apparatus, emergency medical care and rescue, and protecting fire cause evidence.

“We practice those many, many times and then it’s just muscle memory,” said Ryan. “You just remember the steps. It’s just like brushing your teeth.”

Instructor Kurt Blanchard attributes his students’ success to team building, fostering competition, and kinesthetic learning. “We focus first on team building and making

this a very safe learning environment, because in order to succeed, and especially to be a champion, you have to be prepared to fail multiple times,” he explained. “Here we learn how to compete because I think that in being a champion you have to be a good competitor. I’m a big fan of kinesthetic learning, so we do a lot of hands-on.”

Ryan has since been hired as a Resident Firefighter in Burbank, Washington at the Walla Walla County Fire District 5 station, where he will continue his Fire Science education with EMT classes at Columbia Basin Community College and through on-the-job training.

“It feels good,” Ryan said of the win. “It feels like an accomplishment after practicing for so long.”

Opportunities for highly capable students are available K-12 in a variety of academic domains. We emphasize curriculum that is appropriately different in pace and complexity. The program offers regular opportunities for students to work with other students of similar (advanced) academic abilities.

## School Meal and Other Assistance for Families/ Students Facing Housing Problems

If your family is experiencing housing problems, signing up for free school meals is fast and easy, and is one way to make sure your child can grow and learn.

Wenatchee School District's McKinney-Vento Program is in place to address and support nutrition and other needs of students enrolled in Pre-K through 12th grade, who may find themselves in an unstable, temporary or transitional housing situation, due to economic problems, natural disasters, or some other reason that may have forced them to: live temporarily with another family; live in a motel, campground or car; live in an emergency, domestic violence or transitional shelter; or move around in search of affordable, sustainable housing. Or children and youth on their own: living temporarily with another family; living in a motel, campground or car; living in an emergency, transitional or runaway shelter; for some reason.

Our Program works closely with local shelter and housing providers, community agencies offering support services, the City of Wenatchee, Chelan County and Washington state's Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). We work to ensure educational stability for students in short-term/temporary and transitional/homeless housing situations so they feel supported and encouraged while they secure permanent housing.

## Dress Code (Board Policy 3224)

Appearance and attire at school should be neat, clean and within the bounds of decency, health and safety. Dress and appearance shall not be disruptive of the educational process of learning objectives. This dress policy is in accordance with District Policy 3224.

**DRESS STANDARDS**

The following standards are provided to assure the safety and well-being of all students and staff. The key is that school attire should be modest and appropriate. Dress may not be disruptive to the learning environment. In order to maintain a learning environment, here are a few keys:

**MODESTY DRESS CODE**

Tops must have a modest neckline and shoulder line. Spaghetti straps will not be permitted. All tops need to cover the midriff area.

Clothing and/or other accessories that would be considered a disruption to the learning environment are prohibited. Any clothing that goes against our curriculum, respect toward others, or any clothing that is lewd, sexual, drug, tobacco, alcohol-related or gang-related is prohibited.

**SAFETY DRESS CODE**

Footwear must be worn at all times.

Head coverings – religious head coverings are permitted, while the wearing of any other head cover is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to baseball caps, cowboy hats, bandanas, scarves, hairnets, etc.

Clothing that may also be disruptive to the learning environment and are not permitted are: chains, sharp protruding objects protruding from necklaces, collars, bracelets, and rings, sunglasses, charms or jewelry

depicting any kind of weapons, alcohol, tobacco, drug or drug paraphernalia.

Clothing identified as “gang-like” and are not permitted are: Playerz 69, Playboys/Playgirls (bunny logo), Dallas Cowboys, 5-point star, Raiders football, Los Angeles Dodgers, Colonia Chiques, SSL logo, Old English script, “13” or “14” or “22”, Surenos, Nortenos, Smile now/ Cry later (in words or the theatrical mask), Bandanas, Hanging belts (the loose end past the buckle that is hanging down), 8-ball symbols, Marijuana leaf, Clothing with “ICP”, “Insane Clown Posse” or any graphics of “Hatchet Man” representing “Insane Clown Posse”, (gang and violence related), gloves or anything demonstrating affiliation with local gangs.

# Career and Technical Education

CTE provides Career Awareness, Career Preparation, and Career Exploration. Career Awareness experiences are those that help students build awareness of the variety of careers available. These activities are normally defined as one-time interactions with partners for a student or group of students. Career Preparation experiences support college and career readiness and include extended direct interaction with professionals from industry and the community. These experiences are designed to give students supervised practical application of skills and knowledge. Career Exploration provides students with short term direct interaction with partners and

the opportunity to explore career options in a way that contributes to motivation for learning and informs students' decisions about further experiences and educational opportunities. Career Awareness, Career Preparation, and Career Exploration are all deepened in the courses outlined in the next paragraph. Wenatchee School District offers CTE courses in all three of the middle schools, Wenatchee High School and West Side High School. These courses provide hands on, project-based skill training for many careers such as; agriculture, business, medical, graphic arts, journalism, engineering, computer science, photography, technology,

consumer science and family economics. Students will find STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) training, along with equivalency academic credits for high school and Tech Prep community college credits. Most courses include beginning and advanced options. See each school's course catalogue to find a total list of courses and course descriptions. Twenty-seven different teachers offer 47 different courses for students. There is also the opportunity for independent study, job shadows, and internships for advanced students. Some courses offer industry certifications that open the door to employment.

## Earn College Credit While Attending High School

Students can save thousands of dollars towards college credit through a number of dual-credit programs available in Wenatchee School District. Dual-credit programs allow students to earn high school and college credit simultaneously. Students can earn dual credits by completing college courses like Running Start, College in the High School, and Wenatchee Valley Technical Skills programs, or by completing standardized exams like Advanced Placement. Students who earn college credit are more likely to graduate high school, enroll in college, and complete college degrees. Don't miss out on an opportunity to earn college credits for a fraction of the cost they would be when you're attending college. Dual-Credit Programs Offered in Wenatchee School District

### RUNNING START

Washington's Running Start program allows 11th and 12th grade students to take college courses at Washington's community and technical colleges and at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Washington State University, and Northwest Indian College. Running Start courses are regular college courses offered on the college campus. Students pay no tuition; however, they do pay for textbooks, fees, and transportation.

### COLLEGE IN THE HIGH SCHOOL

College in the High School (CHS) programs provide college-level academic courses to 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students. Courses are taught at the high school, by high school teachers, with college curriculum, college textbooks, and oversight by college faculty and staff. Students pay tuition. Some state subsidies are available for rural and small schools and for low-income students. "College in HS provides opportunities to receive college credit while in the high school environment at a fraction of the cost," says Associate Principal Ricardo Iñiguez. "Providing options for students to receive college credit is a win win for both the student and the university. Students who are looking to attain college credits but still be a part of the high school experience are able to do so thanks to the College in the HS opportunity."

### ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Advanced Placement (AP), classes enable students to take college-level courses, taught by high school teachers, at the high school. Upon completion of the course, students take a standardized exam. Scores from the exams are considered by colleges, and varying levels of credit are awarded. Students do not pay tuition, but do pay fees for the final standardized exams. Fee waivers are available for lower-income students.

### TECH PREP

Tech Prep allows high school students to

earn college credits through Career and Technical Education classes such as Accounting, Engineering Technology, Health Occupations, Web Design and more. Tech prep allows you to earn credits toward a two year degree or possibly increase your rank in the military. Students gain valuable occupational skills and related work experience and families save money on tuition books and lab fees. Average cost of 5 credit course at WVC \$380 + books, lab fees and parking. The cost to enroll in Tech Prep is \$15. ### WENATCHEE VALLEY TECHNICAL SKILLS CENTER

Several Wenatchee Valley Technical Skills Center classes offer Tech Prep opportunities too. Students need to have a B or better grade to qualify for college credits.

- Videogame Programming - Wenatchee Valley College - up to 5 college credits
- Collision Repair Technology - Walla Walla Community College - up to 24 college credits
- Culinary Arts - pending approval at Renton Technical College
- Fire Science - pending approval at Wenatchee Valley College

**Washington State school buses** provide over 700,000 student trips per day and travel over 100 million miles per year. Student transportation has the best safety record for any of the ground-based passenger transportation methods. Wenatchee School District takes great pride in providing the safest form of transportation and service to our community’s children.

**Arrive at bus stops:** Please have students to the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the scheduled pick up time. Routes and times are subject to change as bus loads and service area may need adjusting once school has started to balance bus loads.

**Special needs:** Special needs students must preregister with the special needs department prior to riding the buses. Many specific rules and policies govern the ridership on our special needs buses. Parents will be notified of these regulations once registered.

**Basic Ed Students:** Students do not need to preregister, but they must use the assigned school bus stop closest to their residence. A list of all students and their contact information will be compiled in the fall of students riding on each of the buses.

**Kindergartners and Preschoolers:** New this year, Transportation Release forms are required. Students must be met at their bus stop by an adult or responsible sibling which will need to be listed on the release form, or they will be returned back to the school. The forms will be available at the schools and from the bus drivers.

**Scheduled Buses:** Know the ROUTE number of your child’s bus and the name of the driver. The ROUTE number will be displayed on the side of each bus. Be aware that children may ride buses with different ROUTE numbers in the morning and afternoon. The location of their bus stops in the morning and the afternoon also may be slightly different, so check the schedules to be sure you know where your children are picked up and dropped off.

**Bus Passes:** Students (all ages) are only dropped off at their regularly assigned bus stops. They must have a parent note to obtain a bus pass to get off at a different stop location. Each school office will write the pass allowing your child to get off at a different stop. Remind your student to arrange for the pass with the school office BEFORE the end of the day.

**Prohibited Items:** State law prohibits certain items on school buses, including all forms of animal life (except Seeing

Eye dogs), firearms, weapons, breakable containers (glass) latex balloons, flammables, perfumes and aerosol cans. Long boards are NOT permitted on school buses. Skateboards and scooters MUST be completely secured and encased in a backpack. Key chains attached to backpacks and clothing pose a real safety concern, as they can become tangled in the handrails or step-well area of the bus, causing students to trip. Backpacks and musical instruments should be small carry-on types that can sit on the child’s lap or between their legs on the floor. While loading/unloading the buses any bluetooth, head phones or ear pieces that could obstruct hearing are prohibited.

**Lost items:** If something is left behind, drivers normally keep it on the bus so they can return it the next day. You are welcome to call the Transportation office (662-6168) to help locate the lost article or search the lost and found.

**Bus Stop Laws:** Stop for flashing RED. School buses soon will be on the road again, and the WSD Transportation Department reminds all motorists to follow school bus safety procedures:

amber, it means the bus is preparing to stop. Motorists should use caution, but do not have to stop until they see the red lights and stop paddle.

Use extreme caution around school buses. Students are instructed to always look at the bus driver and wait for the signal to cross before they enter the street, but small children have trouble determining the speed or distance of a moving vehicle and may suddenly dart into traffic. Please drive with care around children and expect the unexpected.
