- They have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 and are on track to graduate.

PSAT

Are you a junior planning on taking the ACT or SAT this spring? Are you considering attending a 4- year university after high school? If so, you should register for the PSAT.

The PSAT is a practice test for the SAT and can provide you with helpful information for the ACT as well. This year the test will take place on the morning of **Wednesday**, **October 11 at 7:30**. The **cost of the test is \$16**. You can **register for the test in the ASB office between Friday**, **September 15 and Friday**, **October 6**.

Confluence Health 2017 High School Mentor Program

Goal: The High School Mentor Program is an approved program that offers an "extended observation experience" for selected high school students.

What: Selected students have the opportunity to observe a healthcare professional in their work environment for up to 10 hours. The healthcare professional serves as the "mentor" for the student.

Who: Students currently enrolled at local high schools are eligible to apply for the mentor program. High School Counselors assist with facilitating the program.

When: Applications will be due Thursday, October 5th.

If selected for the interview process, interviews will be held October 9-20th. Students interviewed will be notified of selection by letter October 23-17th. Observation hours will be completed in November.
