Where can I find a report card with grades?

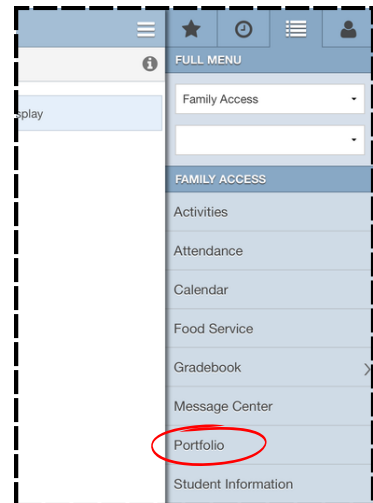


STEP 1 Log into Skyward



In order to see grades, you need to log into Skyward. You can access skyward via the Skyward App, an internet browser (Safari, Chrome) or via Classlink if you are logged into Classlink. You will see the view below when you log in. The view is different if you use a tablet/computer or a phone.

Phone View

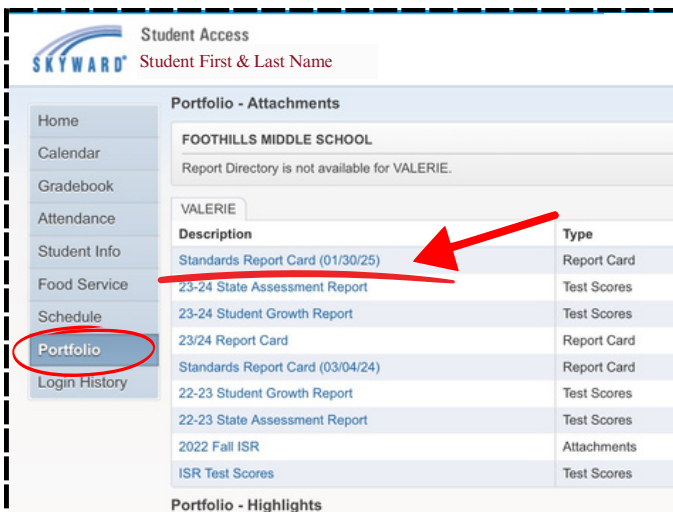


Tablet/Computer View



STEP 2 View your Portfolio to find your grades

Select the box that says portfolio. Once you do, you will see several reports. Look for the "Standards Report Card" with the most current date. Select it and it will open a report with your grades.



STEP 3 View your Grades

You will be able to see all your grades for 1st Semester. You will see grades for all the standards you had test on during 1st Semester. Your report card will look similar to the one below.

PASO 1 Inicia sesión en Skyward

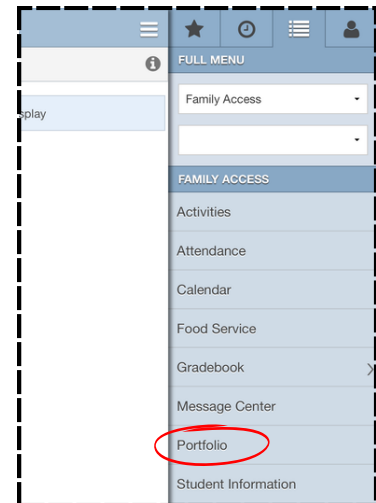

Vista en tableta/computadora

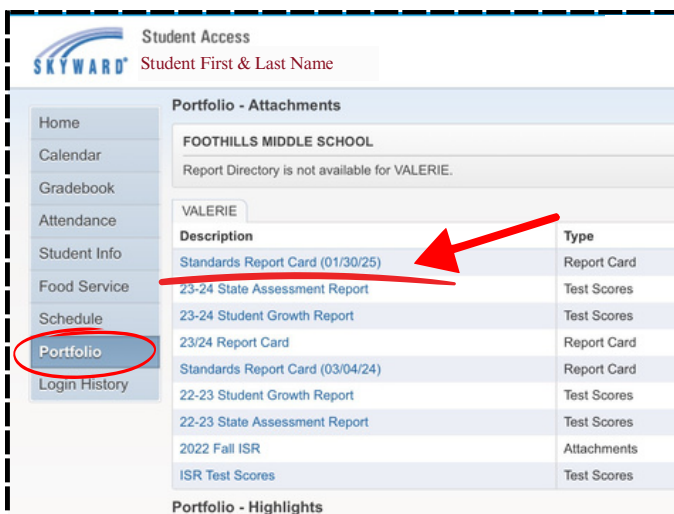


Vista en teléfono



PASO 2 Escoge Portafolio para ver tus calificaciones

PASO 3 Revisa tus calificaciones

GRADES: How do I understand them?



PART 1: What do grades look like at middle school? (Standard Based Grading) How does a number grade translate to a letter grade?

In middle school, grades range from 0 to 4 (Standards Based) instead of being based on 100 points. This allows students and teachers to track learning progress throughout the year. In high school, the grading system will be different. Check the table below to see how the numbers convert to letter grades.

Number Grade (Middle School)	Letter Grade (High School)	What does this mean?	Do I need to contact the teacher?
3.0-4.0	A	Your child is doing great and fully understands the material.	No, unless you have concerns.
2.5-2.9	B	Your child is on track but may need a little more practice in some areas.	Not necessary, but optional.
2.0-2.49	C	Your child is making progress but still has some learning to do.	It may be helpful.
1.25-1.99	D	Your child is having difficulty and may need extra support.	Yes, recommended.
0-1.24	F	Your child is struggling and needs additional help to catch up.	Yes, as soon as possible.

PART 2: Where do I check grade? How do I read my students gradebook? How can I get help for my child?

In Skyward, go to the grade book to see a similar view.

It may seem overwhelming, but focus on the number grades. **A score above 3 means your child is on track.**

Scores below 3 indicate areas for improvement. You can reach out to the teacher through **ParentSquare or email** for more details or help.

CALIFICACIONES: ¿Cómo las entiendo?



PARTE 1: ¿Cómo son las calificaciones (grados) en la secundaria? ¿Cómo se convierten las calificaciones de la escuela secundaria en calificaciones con letra?

En la escuela secundaria, las calificaciones van de 0 a 4 en vez de estar basadas en 100 puntos y grades de letra. Esto permite a los estudiantes y maestros ver el progreso del aprendizaje durante el año. En la preparatoria, el sistema cambiará. Revise la tabla de abajo para entender cómo los números se convierten en calificaciones con letra.

Calificación Numérica (Middle School)	Calificación con Letra (High School)	¿Qué significa esto?	¿Es necesario contactar al maestro?
3.0-4.0	A	Su hijo/a va muy bien y comprende completamente el material.	No, a menos que tenga dudas.
2.5-2.9	B	Su hijo/a está en buen camino pero podría beneficiarse de más práctica.	No es necesario, pero opcional.
2.0-2.49	C	Su hijo/a está progresando, pero aún tiene cosas por aprender.	Podría ser útil.
1.25-1.99	D	Su hijo/a tiene dificultades y puede necesitar apoyo adicional.	Sí, se recomienda.
0-1.24	F	Su hijo/a está teniendo problemas y necesita más ayuda para ponerse al día.	Sí, lo antes posible.

PART 2: ¿Dónde puedo ver las calificaciones (grados)? ¿Cómo leo el libro de calificaciones de mi hijo/a? ¿Cómo puedo obtener ayuda para mi hijo/a?

En Skyward, vaya al libro de calificaciones para ver una vista similar.

Puede parecer mucho al principio, pero enfoque en los números. Un grad de 3-4 indica que su hijo/a va por buen camino.

Si hay grados debajo de 3, son áreas en las que su hijo/a puede mejorar. Puede comunicarse con el maestro a través de ParentSquare o correo electrónico para más detalles o ayuda.
