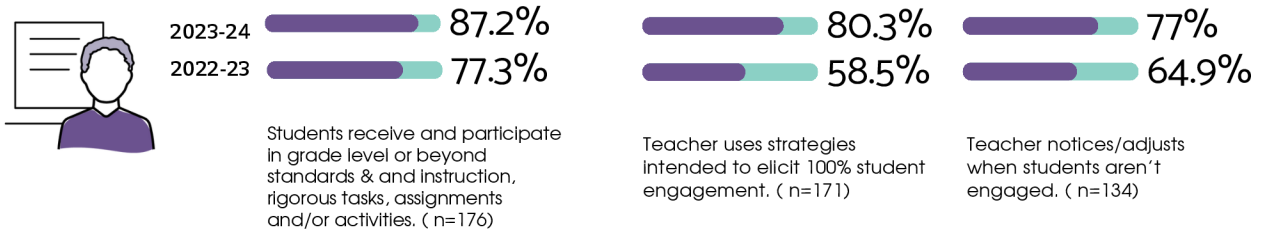


#1 - Experience High-Quality Instruction

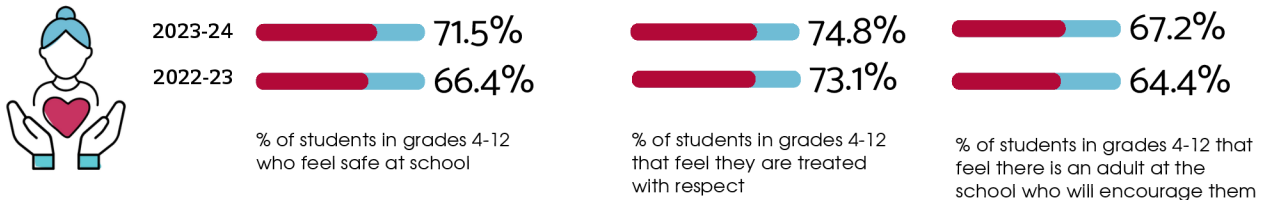
Students receive and participate in grade-level or beyond standards, instruction, and assignments.



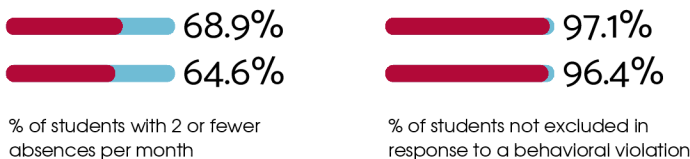

Students know they belong (seen, valued, heard) and have healthy relationships with staff and peers.



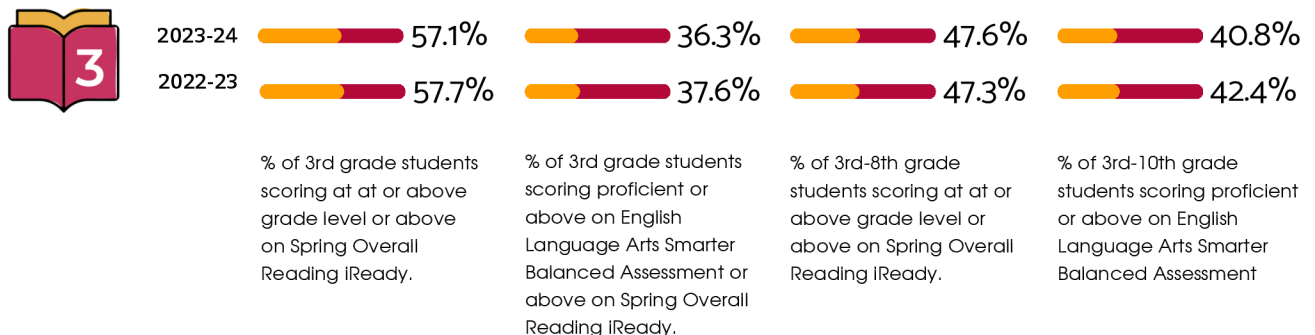

#3 - Read on Grade Level

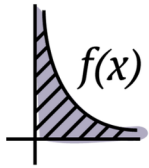
Students will read on grade level by 3rd grade and beyond.

% of students in grades 3-8 scoring proficient or above on Math Smarter Balanced Assessment

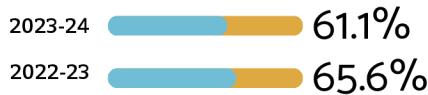


% of K-8 students scoring at Mid-On Grade Level or above on the Spring iReady Assessment in Math overall.
