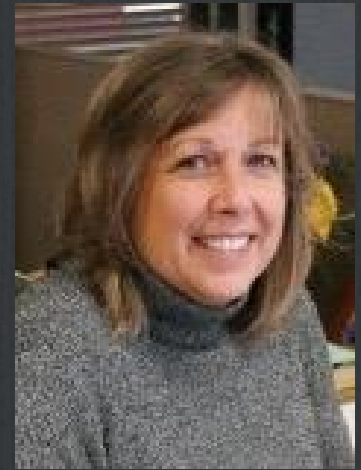

H.S. and Beyond Plan Personalized Pathways Credits

Career Cluster

Grouping of careers that fit a student's interests.

Personalized Pathway Credits

High school that correspond with the student's career cluster

Career Cluster and Personalized Pathways determined at middle school.

Four-Year University Requirements

- **Two Years of Foreign Language**
- **Senior Year Math**
- **ACT/SAT (Junior/Senior Year)**

Required Classes for Freshmen

- **Math**
- **English**

- **Fitness**
- **Health recommended**

Math

Math placement is based on data from assessments, current math, and input from current math teacher.

**Students select from two versions of Introduction to
Physics and Chemistry**

Introduction to Physics and Chemistry

OR

Students have two options.

Freshman English

**Pre- AP Freshman English
(additional rigor and summer reading)**

Fitness (PE)/Health

All freshmen take one credit of Fitness

Students indicate their preference for one of four fitness levels that increase in intensity.

2a, 2b, 3, 4

OR

Walking, Swimming or WHS Sport Online Fitness

International Languages

Can be replaced with personalized pathway credits.

900 Reading Lexile score recommended.

French

German

Spanish 1 or 2

Spanish for the Native Speaker (Based on placement test)

Hybrid 4 Period Block Schedule

Allows students more room for exploration.

Allows for expanded elective course offerings.

Allows students to advance further in a given subject.

Allows for consistent daily schedule.

Allows students to choose between 4 and 8 classes at any given time.

Two Class Structures

All students take eight classes in a year.

Semester = 1.0 Credit

(Meets for 90 consecutive days)

A/B = 1.0 Credit

(Meets every other day for the year)
