No advanced credit will be awarded for courses completed at the community college. For the bachelor degree a student must complete at least 36 semester hours at the advanced level, 24 of which must be completed through A&M-Commerce. A minimum of 60 hours must be completed through instruction provided by Texas A&M University-Commerce or another senior level institution. For degree completion at least 25% of credit semester hours must be earned through instruction provided by A&M-Commerce. A maximum of 60-66 hours may be accepted from a community college, depending upon specific degree requirements.
