



PROPERLY DISPOSE of your medications.

 **This is Joe. Joe is done taking the meds prescribed by his doctor, but he has some left. What can Joe do?**

 **No, Joe!** Dumping meds down the toilet or in the sink effects our drinking and ground water.

 **No, Joe!** Giving or selling your prescribed meds to someone else is illegal.

 **No, Joe!** Throwing meds in the trash makes them accessible to others, and that can be dangerous.

 **Yes, Joe!** Find a participating pharmacy or police station to drop your meds safely and anonymously. (See reverse for locations.)
