Charles E. Tressler Distinguished Teacher Award Nomination Instructions

Purpose of the Award

Hood College presents this award annually to honor distinguished teaching in Frederick County's public school system. Named for a former member of the Hood faculty who encouraged young people to enter the profession of teaching, the Charles E. Tressler Distinguished Teacher Award recognizes an FCPS teacher who has had a significant impact on young people.

Who Can Nominate?

Nominations will be accepted from:

- Current or former students
- Teachers and support staff
- Parents
- Community members
- Administrators and supervisors

Eligibility and Criteria

Nominees must:

1. Hold a current teaching certificate and work directly with students; e.g., classroom teachers, media specialists, special education teachers, intervention teachers, school counselors and student support teachers.
2. Be a full-time FCPS employee.
3. Have been satisfactorily employed by FCPS for three or more consecutive years.
4. Have had a significant impact on the lives of young people.

Nomination Packet

The nomination packet must include and may not exceed:

- The completed nomination application with the signature of the nominee's principal.
- A career summary, maximum 2 pages, that includes:
 - Name, address and telephone number
 - Educational history, including schools, degrees and majors
 - Teaching experience including location, assignment and years
 - Professional and community involvement
 - Awards and accolades
- A typewritten summary, maximum 2 pages, outlining how the nominee has made a significant impact on the lives of young people. Be sure to include concrete examples.

Nominations are due by Friday, March 22, 2019.

Selection Process

A screening committee of FCPS administrators and other staff will review the nominations and select a winner using a rubric evaluation system. The winner will be notified in May.
