

How You Can Help

There are many ways you can help your grandchild in school. One is by volunteering. You can **volunteer** to help:

As a grandparent, if you do not have legal custody or guardianship of your grandchild, with parental consent you are still welcome to attend a teacher **conference**.

- ◆ Conferences are each fall and spring.
- ◆ You (and your family) do not need to wait until those scheduled times to meet with a teacher. Conferences are available upon request. If you are your grandchild's guardian, simply call the school to schedule time with the teacher.

Monitoring **homework** is another way you can help. Be sure to check your grandchild's backpack every day!

 Talk to your grandchild about what he or she is learning.

 Set up a routine that includes a quiet place for completing homework.

 Have school supplies available so your grandchild is ready to complete assignments.

 Offer assistance with homework when your grandchild is struggling...but don't do the homework yourself!
