Graduation Requirements



- History/Social Studies – 3 years (30 credits)
 - World History, US History, US Government, and Economics
- English – 4 years (40 credits)
- Mathematics – 2 years (20 credits)
- Science – 2 years – 1 biological, 1 physical (20 credits)
- World Language or Visual Performing Art – 1 year (10 credits)
- Physical Education – 2 years (20 credits)
- Health – 1/2 year (5 credits)
- Electives – 75 credits

Total credits needed to graduate = 220

UC/CSU “a-g” Requirements



- a - History/Social Studies – 2 years (US History/World History)
- b - English – 4 years
- c - Mathematics – 3 years (Alg 1, Geometry, Alg 2)
 - 4 years recommended
- d - Science – 2 years lab science
 - 3 years recommended
- e - World Language – 2 years of the same language
 - 3 years recommended
- f - Visual Performing Art – 1 year
- g – College Prep Elective – 1 year

- All of the above must be completed with a **C grade or better** to be eligible

Check Your Credits



- By 2nd semester of sophomore year, all students should have a total of **90 credits**
 - Please refer to the transcript distributed in your English class
- A grade of a **D** or higher will earn credits toward **high school graduation**
- **4-year colleges** recognize a **C** or better as a passing grade

TUSD Summer School Policy



- Students are allowed to earn up to **40 credits for advancement** toward graduation through outside educational institutions over the four years
- Courses are limited to a maximum of **10 credits per academic discipline** if they will be applied towards graduation requirements
- Students must submit the [Correspondence Course Pre Approval Request](#) form to their counselor during their scheduling appointment
