LEARNING LABS

LANGUAGE ARTS CENTER LABS

IMPORTANT: Lab Hours M-Th 8:30am-8:30pm and F 8:30am-12:30pm.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- Labs are an open environment where students can learn English language arts skills from non-reader level to competency-based diploma courses.
- ABE program is a literacy program that provides students with essential reading, writing, speaking, listening, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills.
- High school English courses may be taken in self-paced / independent study labs OR in our new Direct Instruction English Fundamentals courses.

LEARNING CENTER

IMPORTANT: For Adult Secondary Education (ASE), High School Diploma & Enrichment Courses, HSE Math exam preparation. Learning Center Hours M-Th 8:30am-8:30pm and F 8:30am-12:30pm.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- Provides direct instruction courses General Basic Math, Algebra, & HSE Math Prep.
- Offers online self-paced independent learning for all high school credit courses.
- Students may enroll in classes required for diploma, enrichment, and/or HSE prep.
- A credentialed teacher and staff are available for all students who need assistance.
- The Learning Center has a 6-hour per week mandatory attendance requirement.

READING SKILLS - SMALL GROUP WORKSHOPS

IMPORTANT: Reading Skills (ABE) students highly encouraged to attend small group workshops to work with a credentialed teacher. Reading Skills Hours M 5:30pm-8:30pm and M & W 12:30pm-2:30pm.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- Workshops provide foundational development and integration of communication skills in four major areas - reading, writing, speaking, and listening.
- Students will develop their reading skills (such as identifying main ideas, supporting details, sequence, facts & opinions) while reading a variety of literature.
- The development of writing skills will help students with understanding sentence structure, subject-verb agreement, participles, and phrases emphasizing parts of speech and their roles.
- Students in this course will increase their vocabulary and understand how to effectively communicate when using the English language.

ENGLISH

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- Students can earn High School English credits and improve English Language Arts skills in order to pass the HSE English Language Arts Reading & Writing Exams.
- Build on seguential development and integration of communication skills in 4 major areas: Reading, Writing, Speaking, & Listening.
- Strengthen an increasingly advanced understanding of the structure of language and grammar, and use this knowledge to write literary analyses, professional career documents, poetry, advanced essays, and a focused research project.
- Students will read and comprehend a variety of literature, including drama, literary fiction, poetry, and foundational American documents.
- Students earn up to 5 English credits upon successful completion of coursework.

GOVERNMENT

CANCELLED

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- Students will gain a strong foundation of the principles of American democracy.
- Learn about the types of governments, focusing on the American form of government
- Students will learn about the history of governments, the characteristics of the United States government, political parties, and the voting process.
- Students earn up to 5 Government credits upon successful completion of coursework.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- Students earn up to 5 US History credits upon successful completion of coursework.

MATHEMATICS COURSES

MATH A

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- This course is designed to develop a solid foundation in basic mathematics to prepare students to advance to prealgebra or algebra courses.
- Topics include basic arithmetic skills & problem-solving: Four Operations in Whole Numbers; Fractions & Decimals, Ratios, Rates, & Proportions; Percent & Percent Change.
- Application of math concepts in real-world problem solving independently and collaboratively, and effective use of technology are incorporated in daily lessons.
- Students earn up to 5 Math credits upon successful completion of coursework.

Math A (Morning): Aug 27 - Nov 21; MWF 9:00am-10:30am; Chang; Hamilton Adult Center Rm 4 Math A (Afternoon): Sep 22 - Dec 12; M & W 1:00pm-3:30pm; Chang; Hamilton Adult Center Rm 4 Math A (Evening): Aug 27 - Nov 21; M & W 5:30pm-8:30pm; Mori; Hamilton Adult Center Rm 4

MATH B

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- This course is designed to transition students from arithmetic to algebra and geometry.
- Course contents include a review of rational number operations and an introduction to algebra, including
 Operations on Signed Numbers, Ratio, Proportion, Percentages, Variable Expressions, Polynomials, and Solving
 Equations & Coordinate Graphing.
- Students earn up to 5 Math credits upon successful completion of coursework.

Math B (Morning): Aug 27 - Nov 21 ; MWF 10:45am-12:15pm ; Chang ; Hamilton Adult Center Rm 4 Math B (Evening): Aug 27 - Nov 21 ; M & W 5:30pm-8:30pm ; Mori ; Hamilton Adult Center Rm 3

ALGEBRA 1A

IMPORTANT: Prerequisites - Pass Diagnostic Test or Pass Math B or Receive Counselor Approval

COURSE DESCRIPTION

- This course focuses on the first half of a standard Algebra 1 curriculum, covering foundational algebraic concepts
 like solving and graphing linear equations and inequalities, understanding variables and expressions, working with
 real numbers, and interpreting word problems through graphs & tables.
- Prepares students to pass the HSE Math Exam.
- Students may repeat the course if needed.
- Students earn up to 5 Algebra credits upon successful completion of coursework.

ALGEBRA 1B

IMPORTANT: Prerequisites - Pass Diagnostic Test or Pass Math B or Receive Counselor Approval COURSE DESCRIPTION

- This course focuses on the second half of a standard Algebra 1 curriculum, covering quadratic equations, exponential functions, advanced graphing techniques, and systems of equations.
- Prepares students to pass the HSE Math Exam.
- Students may repeat the course if needed.
- Students earn up to 5 Algebra credits upon successful completion of coursework.

HSE PREP COURSES

These HSE Prep courses are designed for students who will be taking an HSE Exam (HISET or GED) in one of the subjects in the near future.

- Take practice tests to determine your readiness for the official exam!
- Improve your skills that are necessary for passing the HSE Exams!
- HSE Prep courses are offered every term more dates will be added throughout the year!

HSE WRITING

- Prepares students to take the HSE Writing Exam.
- Practice your reading, speaking, listening, writing skills.
- · Improve your academic writing skills.

HSE PREP (For HSE Reading, HSE Social Studies, and/or HSE Science)

- Prepares students to take the HSE Reading, HSE Social Studies, and/or HSE Science Exams students work on this independently.
 - HSE Reading Students will practice the following reading skills: comprehension, inference
 & interpretation, analysis, and synthesis & generalization.
 - HSE Social Studies Increase your knowledge of the four main social studies content areas: history, civics/government, economics, and geography.
 - HSE Science Increase your knowledge of the three main science content areas: life science, physical science, and earth science.

HSE MATH

- Prepares students to take the HSE Math Exam.
- Pre-requisites Math A, Math B, and preferably Algebra 1A or equivalent.
- Covers necessary math skills and knowledge to pass the HSE Math exam.


Students working toward their high school diploma (HSD) or high school equivalency (HSE) can co-enroll in a Career Technical Education (CTE) class.
