I wanted to provide you with some updates and some reminders:

- All students should have their lanyard and ID with them at all times during the school day. This not only serves as an identification for the student, but it also serves as their "payment" for breakfast and lunch as well as their "ticket" to check out books from our library. Thank you for your help in supporting our students in being ID responsible!
- The next few bullets are for car riders:
 - ⇒ Please have your child to school NO LATER than 7:30 in the morning. Our students need time to go to their lockers, get their breakfasts, and get to their first period class. Arriving after 7:30 puts our students at risk of not getting to first period on time.
 - ⇒ Please drop off your child on the SOUTH side of the Decatur Township School for Excellent. We want to keep the front circle clear of any traffic during this time. Thank you for not dropping off your child by the orange cones out front and for following our car rider drop off procedures.
 - ⇒ In the afternoon for car rider pick-up, please enter the Decatur Township School for Excellent (DTSE) parking lot off of High School Road using the SOUTH entrance. Upon entering, please make a loop all the way around the DTSE parking lot and then work your way back to the SOUTH. Thank you for entering the parking lot using the correct entrance as entering from the other side can cause back-ups on High School Road.

For this opening project, learners participated in workshops to explore their leadership style and academic strengths and challenges in order to set them up for success as we move into the upcoming interdisciplinary content projects throughout the rest of the school year. The 7th grade learners created multimedia vision boards with keynote or iMovie to present what they learned about themselves throughout this first experience with the PBL pro-

cess. The 8th grade learners created resumes and cover letters and participated in one-on-one interviews with facilitators to apply for a spot in collaborative grouping for the projects to come, and to prepare crucial real life skills for high school and beyond.

In the middle of the hard work of the first two weeks, Apex learners, facilitators and parent volunteers took an exciting field trip to the Indiana State Fair! The learners were able to explore the "Farm to Table" exhibits and learn how Indiana agriculture has impacted the evolution of our food. They also had a blast meeting, feeding and petting horses, cows, goats and all of the oth-

er animals at the fair. In the Apex community, we take great pride in establishing a positive, family culture and our awesome day at the fair got us off to a great start in building that culture between our staff, parents and students. Our first two weeks are commencing with the first Apex "Family Friday" of the school year, a celebration for both grade levels where we continue to establish our culture with community building activities and an ice cream party. 21st Century Scholars



Indiana's 21st Century Scholars program offers income-eligible Hoosier students up to four years of paid tuition at an eligible Indiana college or university after they graduate from high school, dependent upon financial need. 7th and 8th grade Indiana students whose families meet income eligibility guidelines can apply to become a 21st Century Scholar. Applications must be received by June 30 of the student's 8th grade year.

As a Scholar, you pledge to:

- Complete the Scholar Success Program, which includes activities at each grade level in high school to help you stay on track for college and career success.
- Graduate from a state-accredited high school with a minimum of a Core 40 diploma and a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Not use illegal drugs, commit a crime or delinquent act, or consume alcohol before reaching the legal drinking age.
- File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by April 15 as a high school senior and each year thereafter until you graduate from college.
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards established by your college.
- Complete 30 credit hours each year you are in college to stay on track toward earning your degree on time.

7th Grade Explorations

During iTime this week, Explorations 7th graders had the opportunity to discover possible ideas for their iTime projects by listening to presenters talk to them about their own passions. After filling out a questionnaire that targeted certain characteristics, students were divided into two groups.

The first group listened to Jason Burcham, a representative with the IBEW, tell them about electrical and construction career options. Students learned that apprenticeship programs are another pathway to consider after high school. Mr. Burcham shared that his passion of electrical work has allowed him to be involved in some neat projects such as the building of the Indianapolis International Airport and Lucas Oil Stadium. The students were impressed that his job has also allowed him to be involved with three different Super Bowls.

The second group listened to Paul Dieterlen, who has a passion for wood working. Students listened intently as he explained his passion and the time it takes for him to build his many projects. Mr. Dieterlen brought examples of tools he uses to build and a few of his finished products. They were in awe of what he was able to build with a piece of wood using non-electric tools. Students are invited to join him at Avon Library on September 23rd for a free wood carving demonstration.

We are excited to have both presenters willing to answer questions and mentor students during the year who choose to explore electricity or wood working during their iTime. We will continue to have different presentations throughout the year that will help students discover new passions.



8th Grade Explorations

Our 8th grade Explorations students also took a student interest survey so teachers could begin to organize students into iTime groups. Since most of our 8th grade students are familiar with iTime, we anticipate beginning iTime projects much sooner. Again, please let us know if you know of someone who is interested in sharing their skills with our students.



Explorations Fundraiser

We will host a Creative Gatherings Wood Painting Sign Fundraiser on Tuesday, September 26 from 6:30-8:30pm in the Decatur Middle School cafeteria. \$10 from each sign will go to the Explorations SLC fund to help pay for field trips and other SLC student needs.

At the fundraiser, the party facilitator will bring all the materials you need to create a wood sign that you love. Creative Gatherings has over 600 designs, 6 stain colors and 60 paint colors. You must pre-order the sign you want to paint, so they can stain the wood and cut the vinyl stencil ahead of time. Creative Gatherings signs cost between \$35-\$60.

Creative Gatherings has 2 collections of signs. The Ready2Go requires a \$10 non-refundable security deposit. The security deposit goes toward the cost of your sign.

- Isaiah took it upon himself to help a new student with his work and

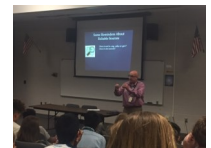
schedule.

- A student lost his glasses, and Dominick volunteered to help him retrace his steps. The glasses were eventually found!

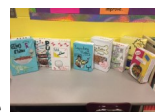
During Intervention and Enrichment time this past week, 8th grade Global students have been digging into each element of IDEA! We are excited to see the powerful concepts our students explore this year.
