Dean A. Kharasch, Special Investigator with the Lake County State's Attorney's Office, will educate parents on the allure and dangers lurking behind our children's devices. He will address questions such as:

- The Dark Web--what is it and what specific sites do parents need to be aware of?
- What dangerous products can be purchased on the dark web?
- Are there internet monitoring tools for at home and on cell phones?
- · Can my child be breaking the law without knowing it?
- How easy is it for my teen to get a fake ID on the internet?
- · How can we help prevent cyber-bullying?

Dean Kharasch has been an investigator with the Lake County State's Attorney's Office since 2001. Between 2001 and 2006, Dean was the State's Attorney's Drug Prosecutions Investigator and then moved into the Cyber Crimes Division in 2007 where Dean has expanded and increased the role of the Lake County State's Attorney's Office Cyber Division. The Cyber Division has become the major forensic support site for over 35 police departments in a county of over 750,000 residents. Dean has worked with and provided forensic support to the FBI, the DEA and the Department of Homeland Security.

For the last 7 years, Dean has continuously presented internet safety talks to adult and children's organizations throughout the Lake County area and around the state of Illinois. He also gives specialized training to law enforcement on the latest topics and developments related to digital technology and handling digital evidence at crime scenes.
