#### Parent Notifications

As you are likely aware, the Middle School and Westwood Elementary experienced a power outage and subsequent early dismissal on Thursday, November 29. As part of the district's response to that event, an error occurred in which parent notification came via email only. Please know that for events like yesterday, parent notification in the future will continue to come in the form of email and text message, similar to what you receive when the message is related to inclement weather, like a snowstorm.

#### Pedestrian Safety

I wrote to you in the October newsletter about before school drop-off and after school pick-up of students. Since then we've noticed an increase in the number of parents following our procedures and as a result, an overall safer parking lot/pedestrian situation for everyone. Thank you for that! Sometime early last month I sent an email to all families about students crossing 9<sup>th</sup> Street at one designated spot – where Westwood Drive intersects with 9<sup>th</sup> Street. Similar to the parking lot situation, the 9<sup>th</sup> Street crossing situation has improved since our email went out. Thank you for that also! I wanted to visit this topic one more time in our newsletter as a reminder that when the winter months are upon us the need for rule following, observant, and patience drivers around and near the school is of utmost importance. 

## Chromebook Care

At the start of the 2018 school year the West De Pere School District implemented our 1:1 Chromebook initiative. In August each middle school student was assigned a Chromebook and carrying case that will remain in their care for the duration of the school year. Students are expected to bring their device home every night and charge it, and return to school with it the next day. *Please help reinforce this routine with your child.* Also, please review these general precautions with your child:



- Do not use food or drink near your Chromebook.
- Be careful when inserting and removing all cords, cables, and accessories.
- Do not pack the carrying case full of other school supplies.
- While walking in the hallways your Chromebook must always be in your closed case.
- Do not carry your Chromebook by the screen or with the screen open.
- Do not write or draw on the Chromebook.
- Do not place additional stickers, decals, or other adhesives to your Chromebook.
- Do not leave your Chromebook in an area that could become very cold or very hot.
- Do not leave your Chromebook in an area that is unsupervised.
- When not using a Chromebook, they should be stored in a locked locker, or in a safe place designated by a teacher (ie- a locked classroom).

### Repairing/Replacing Your Chromebook

In the event that your Chromebook, charging cord, or carrying case gets broken or fails to work properly, please immediately bring it to the Library Media Center. ***Do not take district owned Chromebooks to an outside computer service for any type of repairs or maintenance.***

#### Accidental Damage

If a Chromebook is damaged accidentally, students/parents may have to pay, based on 3 tiers:

- 1st issue- District will cover the cost
- 2nd issue- Students/parents will pay a \$60 repair fee
- 3rd issue- Students/parents are required to cover 100% of the repair/replacement cost, up to the full cost of the device, and/or charging cord, and/or carrying case.

#### Intentional Damage

If a Chromebook is damaged intentionally (including, but not limited to improper care, neglect, and/or misuse), students/parents are required to cover 100% of the repair/replacement cost, up to the full cost of the device, and/or charging cord, and/or carrying case.
