Over the years, our small school has consistently produced **BIG RESULTS**. We have received numerous academic awards and distinctions. Our athletic teams have won numerous conference, regional, and state championships. An entire wall in our building is adorned with the pictures and accomplishments of student-athletes who have gone on to semi-professional and professional sports.

We have dedicated staff that are committed to academically challenging each student so they're college ready and prepared to contribute and be respectable leaders in a diverse society. A Leader in Personalizing Education—Points of Pride

- We are an AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) National Demonstration School that focuses on closing the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness. We were the first National Junior-Senior AVID Demonstration School in the country in 2011.
- The College Board bestowed the Gaston Caperton Inspiration Award on the high school in 2012.
- The Junior-Senior High School was named a Best High School in 2013 by U.S. News.
- The Washington-Post named the school to its list of most Academically Challenging High Schools in 2015.
- We provide formal college visitations every year to 8th and 10th grade students, plus many additional college trips are scheduled by AVID classes throughout the year.
- We offer 12 AP classes; all enrolled students are required to take the tests.
- Our district leads the way with the NJDOE Option II program. Students use non-traditional experiences to count toward graduation requirements. In addition, this program tracks our students' service-learning hours. They must complete 72 hours to graduate.
- We are proud to offer our seniors the option of attending Rowan College at Gloucester County during the school day (30% attend). Students may earn as many as 12 credits toward college, with no out-of-pocket costs to them.
- Twenty-four percent of the Class of 2017 passed one or more AP tests.
- Ten percent of our graduating class passed AP Calculus.
- On average, 10% of our students are AP scholars.

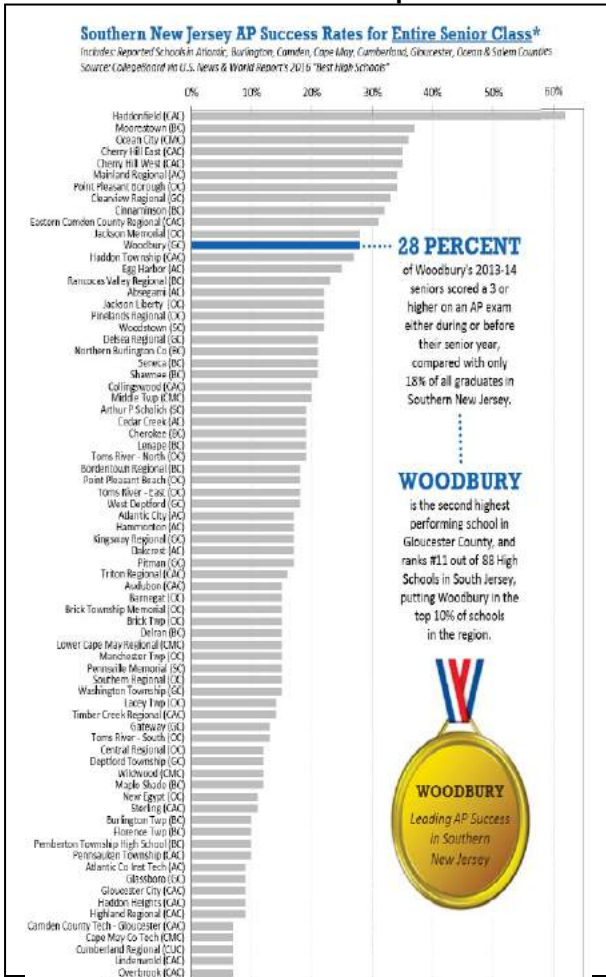

Graduation Requirements

Each student must earn 130 credits in order to graduate, taking the following courses:

- One half year of Economics/Financial Lit.
- One year of Visual/Performing Arts
- One year of World Language
- One year of 21st Century/Careers & Technology
- Three years of Math
- Three years of Social Studies
- Three years of Science
- Four years of Physical Education/Health
- Five years of English
- 72 Hours of Service Learning
- Additional electives to meet the requirements of 130 credits

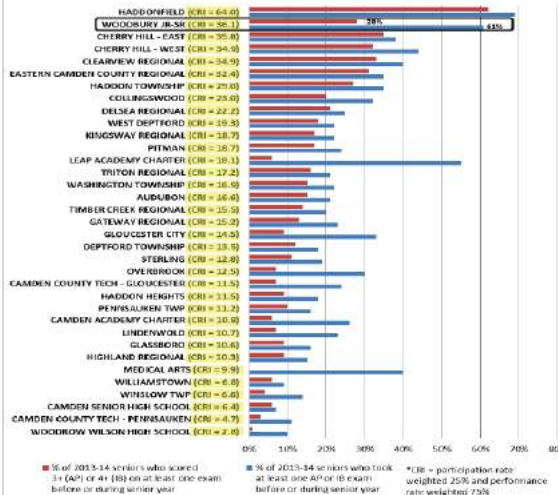
Ranking

Rank is cumulative and based on the final grade earned in each class. All Honors and Advanced Placement are weighted at factor of 1.1 which is reflected in the weighted GPA reported on the official transcript. All students who project enrollment of two complete years at WHS are included in the rank (grades from previous high schools are included in the calculation for all transfer students). Option II courses are not factored in the GPA.
