We have much to celebrate and be thankful for at SCA! Preliminary results for fiscal year 2014/2015 indicate a movement back to a 'break-even' financial position as compared to our 2013/2014 fiscal year, while at the same time accomplishing significant program enhancements and campus improvements. In the coming years, we hope to move to a surplus position by attracting new students and families. Please help us by spreading the word about St. Catherine's Academy!

SCA experienced a record breaking year of generosity during fiscal year 2014/2015! Individual contributions, bequest gifts, and foundation grant awards resulted in donations exceeding budgeted amounts by 67%.

As our partners in education, you have helped us to:

- Make a St. Catherine's education possible for 73 students in need by awarding \$473,345 in tuition assistance
- Upgrade mobile technology in the classroom by purchasing faculty laptops and installing wireless interactive projectors
- Conserve energy and resources by converting to LED lighting in school classrooms
- Preserve our historic campus with a variety of renovations, including campus-wide roof re-coating and updates to staff housing.

We are daily grateful to you for supporting the cadets of St. Catherine's through your contributions, volunteer efforts, and prayers. We look forward to continued opportunities to serve our students and accomplish our mission in the new academic year.

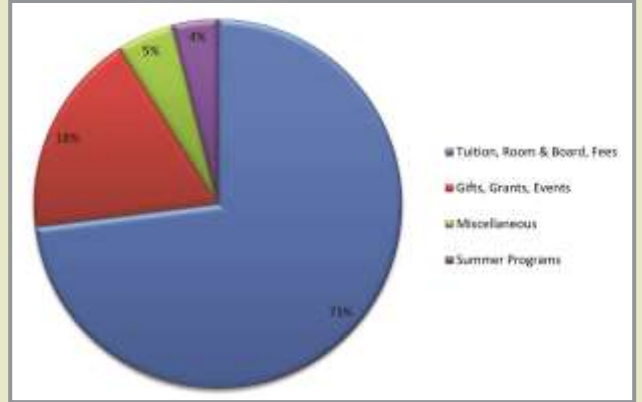

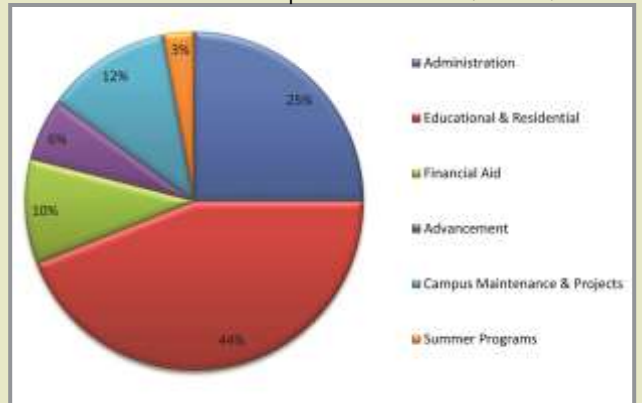

Total Revenues: \$4,717,078



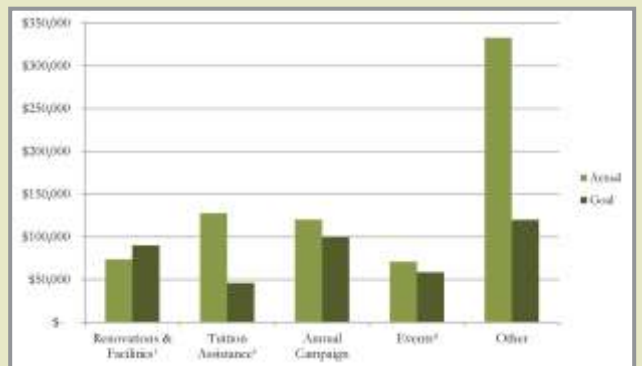
Total Expenses: \$4,810,805

# International Program Continues to Grow

**S**t. Catherine's is truly one of a kind, so it's no wonder that it attracts students from all over the world. Our current study body includes 29 international students from Mexico and China. In recent years, SCA has also been home to students from Thailand, South Korea, Australia, the Philippines, Russia, and Nigeria.

SCA's international program first began in 1936 and consisted of students from Mexico who wanted to learn English and experience life in America. Our tradition of Mexican cadets remains very strong with many "legacy" students following in the footsteps of their fathers and grandfathers who attended SCA decades earlier.

## English Language Instruction

St. Catherine's Academy offers an English Language Learners (ELL) program for students whose native language is not English. Students in the program take self-contained classes in English-heavy subjects like literature, grammar, and history and join mainstream classes for subjects like math, science, and music. This combination supports students as they develop fluency while also challenging them to practice newly acquired skills.

Many ELL students are ready to be completely mainstreamed after just one year in the program.

This year, SCA is pleased to welcome our first Chinese teaching intern—Mrs. Jing Ma, who is completing her Masters of TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages) at CSU, Fullerton. Mrs. Ma will work alongside our ELL teacher, Mrs. Nancy Hopkins, to assist Chinese-speaking students as they learn English vocabulary and grammar. She will also assist with parent interactions and communications with the larger Chinese community.

## A Diverse Community

An important aspect of SCA's International Program, for both foreign and domestic students, is the diverse community it creates. Students learn many lessons outside the classroom, like respect for different cultures, international customs and traditions, and hospitality. Most importantly, they develop friendships with other boys from around the world. This is true preparation to become the future leaders of our global society!

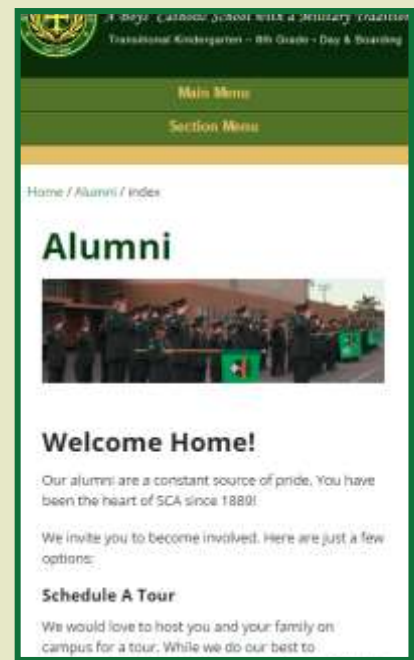

## Dominican Order Celebrates 800 Years

The year 2016 marks the 800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order, to which the Sisters of St. Catherine's Academy belong.

This special Jubilee Year will be celebrated by Dominicans around the world from November 7, 2015 (the Feast of All Saints of the Dominican Order) through January 21, 2017 (the date that Pope Honorius issued *Gratiarum omnium*, which recognized St. Dominic's followers as an Order dedicated to study and universally authorized to preach).

The theme of the global celebration is "Sent to preach the Gospel," recognizing the Dominican commitment to preaching.



### DOMINICAN PILLARS AT ST. CATHERINE'S ACADEMY

St. Catherine's Academy was founded in 1889 by the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose. The Dominican Sisters continue to own and operate the school as one of the Congregation's three sponsored schools. St. Catherine's Academy is built upon the four Dominican pillars of community, ministry (service), study, and prayer—creating a faith-filled community where students are able to grow in their personal spirituality and preach God's word through their daily living.

#### Community

The pillar of community is emphasized by our military and Catholic traditions. In fact, many cadets list "brotherhood" as their favorite aspect of St. Catherine's Academy. SCA students learn to work together, rely on each other, and help one another. They form lasting bonds.

#### Examples of Community at SCA:

- Students and staff pack the gym to cheer on the basketball and volleyball teams.
- Cadet officers make sure all other students have lunch before eating to show a focus on others.
- Local students welcome international students to share holidays and weekends in their homes.

#### Ministry (Service)

The pillar of ministry comes to life through community

service. Throughout the year, students participate in a variety of service activities and fundraising drives to support the less fortunate. SCA cadets learn to share their gifts and talents with those around them, especially those in need.

#### Examples of Ministry at SCA:

- Each military company adopts a local charity and collects non-perishable items to help those they serve.
- The Color Guard presents colors at special events for many local nonprofits and civic organizations.
- Students learn about Friedrich's ataxia and children's heart disease and then run and jump for cures during our annual jog-a-thon fundraiser.

#### Study

The pillar of study revolves around *Veritas*, a Dominican motto meaning truth. SCA students learn to seek truth through an outstanding educational program that encourages curiosity, creativity, and critical thinking.

#### Examples of Study at SCA:

- Students in our Early Childhood Program utilize technology to practice math skills.
- Middle school cadets teach scientific concepts to younger students on annual Science Day.
- Approximately 50% of students study a musical instrument.

## About the Dominican Order

The Dominican Order is a Roman Catholic religious order, consisting of priests, nuns, sisters, and lay people. It is best known for its dedication to holistic education and the pursuit of truth (Veritas). Dominicans are preachers, meaning they spread the Gospel through words and actions. In fact, the Dominican Order is also known as the Order of the Preachers. The Dominican Order was founded by Saint Dominic de Guzman in 1219.

Sisters from St. Catherine's Academy are members of the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose based in Fremont, California. This congregation was founded in 1876 by Mother Maria Pia Backes, OP to serve "the young, the poor, and the vulnerable."

Today the congregation is made up of about 200 Dominican Sisters who live in northern and southern California and seven communities in Mexico.

Dominican Sisters at St. Catherine's Academy hold positions in school administration, teaching, resident care, music, and nursing. Eleven sisters work or live on campus and have daily interaction with our students. Since 1889, 425 Dominican Sisters have ministered at SCA!

### Prayer

The pillar of prayer is woven throughout all dimensions of school life. From formal prayer, such as morning prayer and weekly Eucharist, to more informal experiences, such as military cadences that call on Dominican saints, SCA cadets learn that prayer is relevant in a variety of situations.

#### Examples of Prayer at SCA:

- 8th graders participate in a retreat led by our Dominican Sisters.
- The entire school community comes together for Eucharist each Friday.
- Students pray a decade of the Rosary each day at morning formation during October, the month of the Holy Rosary, and May, the month of Mary.
