- PARCC: Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College & Careers
 - Grades 3-8 , Math & ELA
- KIDS: Kindergarten Individual Development Survey
 - Kindergarten
 - Approaches to Learning & Self Regulation, Social & Emotional Development, Language & Literacy, Cognition: Math (14 State Readiness Measures)
- ISA: Illinois Science Assessment
 - Grades 5 & 8
- IPFA: Illinois Physical Fitness Assessment
 - Grades 3-8
- ACCESS Testing
 - Grades K-8, if identified as English language learners (EL)
- NAEP: National Assessment of Educational Progress
 - Grade 8, select group of students

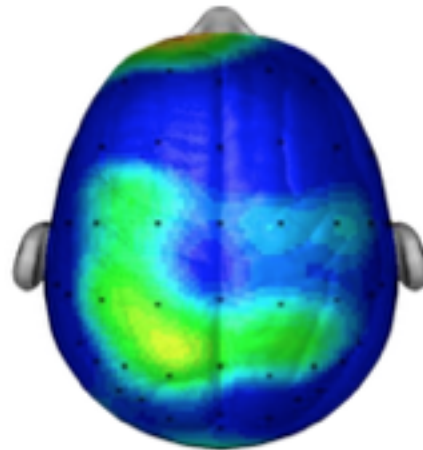
- Grades 5 and 8 Topics include:
 - Earth and Space Sciences
 - Engineering, Technology, and Applications of Science
 - Life Science
 - Physical Science
- Pilot year: April 2016
- First formal year of assessment: March 2017
- Second year of assessment: March 2018

IPFD: Illinois Physical Fitness Assessment (Grades 3-8)

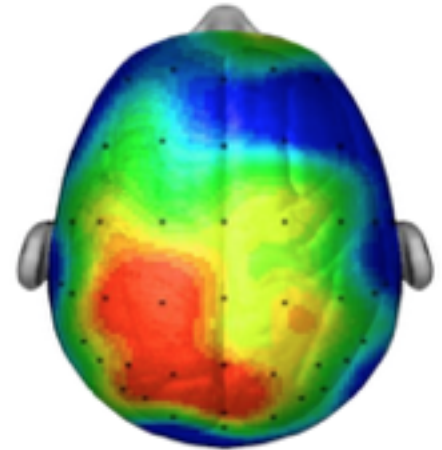
- Went into effect Jan. 27, 2016
- Goal: “Students achieve and maintain a health-enhancing level of physical fitness.”
- Assessments include:
 - Aerobic capacity
 - Flexibility
 - Muscular Endurance
 - Muscular Strength
- Pre & Post assessments administered (Fall/Spring)

Brains after sitting quietly

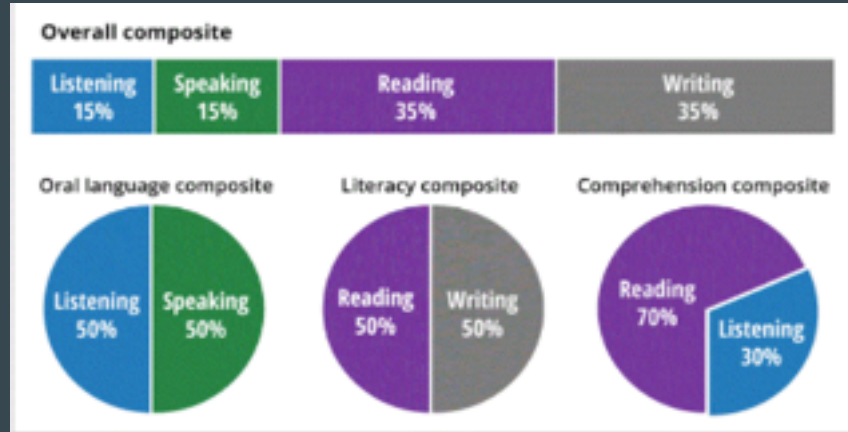


Brains after 20 minute walk



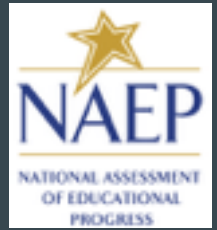
ACCESS Testing: English Language Proficiency Assessment

- Standards based assessment
- Measures English language learners' social and academic proficiency in English
 - Social and instructional English
 - Language arts, math, science, and social studies
- Proficiency scores to pass the ACCESS include an Overall Composite, reading and writing

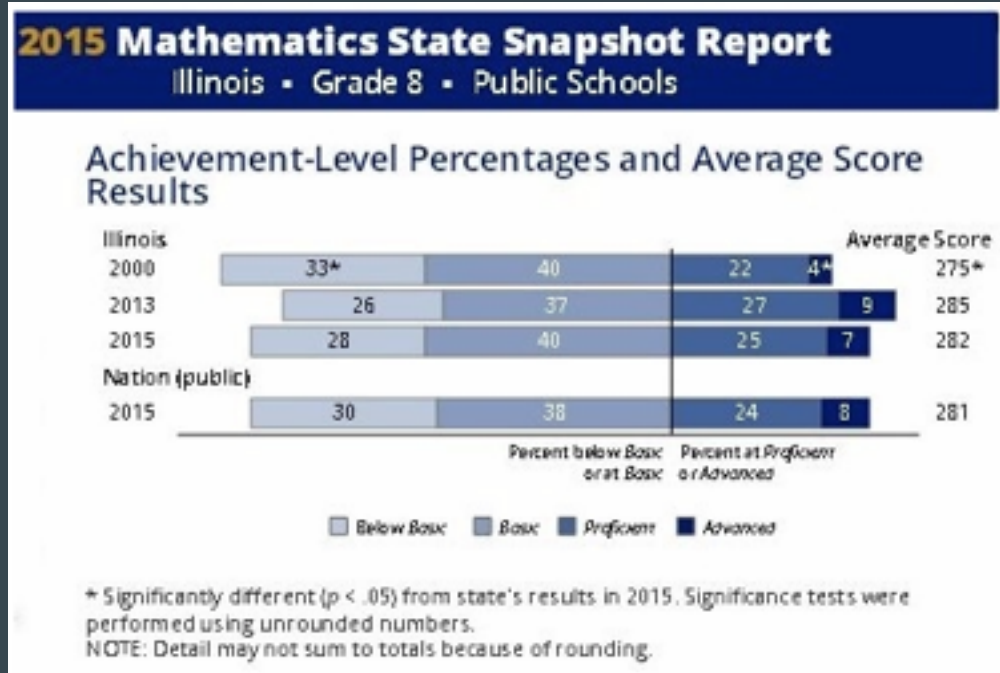


NAEP: National Assessment of Educational Progress

- OGS will have grade 8 participate in January 2018



- “The Nation’s Report Card”
- Scores are not provided to individual schools, reported as sub-groups
 - Grade level
 - Gender
 - Ethnicity
- Grades 4, 8, and 12 in reading and math
- National Center for Educational Statistics randomly selects schools and students to participate annually



Testing Windows



- **IPFA: Illinois Physical Fitness Assessment**
 - Sept 18-22, 2017 and April 23-27, 2018 (Grades 3-8)
- **KIDS: Kindergarten Individual Development Survey**
 - First assessment window closed November 17, 2017
- **ACCESS Testing**
 - January 17 - February 27, 2018 (K-8 as needed)
- **NAEP: National Assessment of Educational Progress**
 - January 2018 (Grade 8 - select students)
- **ISA: Illinois Science Assessment**
 - March 13-14, 2018 (Grades 5 & 8)
- **PARCC: Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College & Careers**
 - April 9-20, 2018 (Grades 3-8)
