



About the Pulaski Community School District

The Pulaski Community School District is located in the heart of Wisconsin and is one of the largest school districts by area in the state. It encompasses 176 square miles and is made up of five elementary schools, one middle school, and one high school. It is organized on a preK-5, 6-8, 9-12 philosophy and serves over 3,700 students. PCSD staff have embraced a culture of collaboration and are invested in their Professional Learning Community (PLC) journey.

The district offers an array of programs including Early World Language, 4K-fifth grade coding, pre-engineering programs and certification for nursing assistants. Additionally, the district has an innovative community education program (PACE), which offers classes to all ages and a summer school program that serves around 2,000 students each year. PCSD is home of numerous Golden Apple recipients and multiple Golden Apple Teachers of Distinction.

Pulaski High School has partnerships with local universities and colleges and offers more than 40 Advance Placement, college-credit, articulated and transcribed courses. Overall, the PHS student average ACT composite is 21.5 or higher the past five years. More than 85% of PHS graduates go on to higher education. The Red Raider Marching Band appeared in Tournament of Roses parades in 2007, 2012 and 2017. PHS also features a nationally recognized culinary arts team. Through school and community partnerships the Red Raider Field of Dreams Steering Committee raised money for a new football, track and field, and band complex, which opened in September 2016 and a new baseball/softball facility is slated to open in late spring 2019.

District Philosophy

We believe that a community's and a nation's greatest resource is its people, especially the students of our schools. At Pulaski Community School District, the student is the nucleus of the school system and our education decisions are guided by what we consider to be best for every student. We maintain that the student should be given reasonable opportunity to realize his/her best self.

We are now, and should continue to be, offering the student a second, third, and fourth chance. This means that every available alternative will be explored to help the student grow academically and develop in self-control. Each new opportunity in the area of discipline will be designed to encourage the students to accept responsibility for their actions. New alternatives in the area of academics will be explored, when necessary, to satisfy the students' needs and interests.

It is our belief that our curriculum should serve the needs, interests and abilities of the student population and promote the mental and physical health of the student. It should instill a pride in heritage and a sense of responsibility and provide the proper information, emphasis and perspective for learning to live a successful life in our local community as well as the nation and the world.

Our education system should help each student increase his knowledge, build greater understanding, and develop social attitudes and acceptable behavior to prepare him/her to be a contributing member of society. We feel that our curriculum must have a wide enough scope to prepare the college bound student, the vocationally oriented student, as well as the student who will seek a job upon graduation.

Our belief is that the Pulaski Community School District should focus not only on its children, but it should also provide the adult members of the school community the facilities and services to continue their education. A school and community that works closely together can use the students, faculty and administrators to evaluate the assets, needs and possibilities of the community and help provide direction for its growth. The community becomes a true learning laboratory.



The Pulaski Community School District serves approximately 20,000 families and individuals that live in townships and villages that are within the Pulaski Community School District including Angelica, Chase, Flintville, Green Valley, Hobart, Krakow, Laney, Lessor, Little Suamico, Maple Grove, Morgan, Oneida, Pittsfield, Pulaski, Sobieski, and parts of Suamico. The population growth rate of Pulaski is higher than the state and national averages.

Within our communities, we have beautiful parks with playgrounds and multiple baseball, softball, and soccer fields for organized and recreational use. From Veteran's Memorial Park in Pulaski to Four Seasons Park in Hobart to the Stone Barn park in Chase there are open green spaces for picnics and serene enjoyment.

The Village of Pulaski is located just 30 miles from Green bay, 40 miles from Appleton, and 80 miles from Wausau. It is close to diverse cultural, recreational, dining and shopping opportunities in Green Bay, yet just minutes from the wealth of outdoor recreational opportunities of Wisconsin's vacationland. Many, many institutions of higher education are located nearby in the Green Bay area.

Pulaski offers a community swimming pool, located in the middle school. Additionally, every July, Pulaski hosts the annual "Pulaski Polka Days" when the community enjoys music, parades, dancing and Polish cuisine.
