

# AP Changes for 2019-2020 School Year

Pulaski High School would like to inform parents and students of upcoming changes that College Board is instituting with the AP program starting with the **2019-2020** school year. These changes will include the following:

- Starting next year, students will be signing up online in their AP classes at the beginning of the school year and will create a College Board account that must also be used for any future AP classes.
- College Board will also be implementing new online student and teacher resources for AP classes that will be available starting next year.
- The registration for ordering AP exams will also be much earlier than it has been in the past. Students interested in taking an AP exam will receive registration information on District Walk-in Registration Day in August and on the first day of school. Students must complete the registration form and \$94 payment (per exam) **prior to October 4th** in order to order an AP exam for Spring 2020. After October 4th, students will no longer be able to order an AP exam for Spring 2020. All exam payments are final - there are NO REFUNDS if you choose not to take the exam at a later date!

<b>Test paperwork</b>	Students must attend a pre-administration session in April to complete testing paperwork. No pre-administration session needed; exam answer sheets will be pre-populated with student information.
<b>Online AP resources for students/teachers.</b>	None	Available after students register in September - includes unit guides, AP question bank, personal progress check and progress dashboard.
