STAY HOME WITH THESE SYMPTOMS

- 100-degree fever or higher
- New onset of cough
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea, vomiting
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion or runny nose
- Cough, fatigue, headache, sore throat, muscle or body aches, chills or diarrhea



HEALTH AND HYGIENE

- Clean in, Clean Out program
- Hand sanitizing stations added
- Parents must screen students for symptoms daily
- Everyone must wear masks
- Safety signage: symptoms, physical distancing, hygiene
- Plexiglass barriers in public spaces, areas where people can't physically distance



FACILITY ROUTINES

- No large group assemblies
- Water bottle refilling stations
- Physical distancing maintained
- Floor and table stickers in high-traffic areas to help space out staff, students
- Staggered use of shared spaces



ISOLATION PROTOCOL

- Students with symptoms:
- Will be isolated
 - Must wear masks
 - Cannot ride the bus home
 - Must be picked up promptly by parents/guardians or other pickup arrangements must be promptly made



BUS TRANSPORTATION

- Reduced number of students on bus at one time
- Face masks required
- Additional cleaning procedures
- Revised loading, unloading procedures



CAFETERIA PROCEDURES

- Students wash/sanitize hands prior to eating
- All foods wrapped or pre-served by staff
- No shared serving utensils
- Touchless check-out system
- Online menus only



RECESS

- Hands washed before and after recess
- Added supervision to encourage physical distancing
- Zoned/staggered recess times



GROUP WORK

- Physical distancing maintained
- No shared equipment
- Additional cleaning procedures in place



VISITORS AND VOLUNTEERS

- Parents/guardians/volunteers/visitors remain outside
- Follow established school protocols
- Parents/guardians remain outside before or after school
