OF THE REGULAR BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING**

**MEETING CALL TO ORDER**

Board President, Mrs. Margy Brown, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

**PLEDGE TO THE FLAG**

Superintendent Bonnewell introduced Chief Roland Nenni of the Albion Police Department. Chief Nenni had been invited by the Board President and Superintendent to speak to the Board. Chief Nenni commended the great relationship that exists between the school and the Police Department. Superintendent Bonnewell and Chief Nenni are in constant communication regarding activities in and out of school that may appear suspicious. There is now an increased police presence in each of the buildings every day.

Chief Nenni pointed out that the school is the center hub of the community and that the officers being in the schools each day foster a great relationship with students and staff. Chief Nenni indicated that communication is key between the department and the school as the relationship continues to grow.

A future presentation is planned for the Board, during Executive Session, in which Chief Nenni will discuss preparedness and responses the department has in place to ensure the continued safety of the school.

- A. Audit Finance Committee

Mr. Liddle presented the recommendation for the ACSD 2018-2019 School Budget in a Power Point presentation. A review of revenues and expenditures indicate increases in salaries and benefits, health insurance, technology and BOCES tuitions. There have been staff decreases, retirements and bond payment decreases. Overall, the budget has increased 1.23% while the tax levy is projected to decrease slightly. The Budget Hearing is scheduled for May 8, 2018 at the High School LGI with Statewide Voting Day to be held May 15, 2018 from Noon to 8:00 pm in the Ronald L. Sodoma Elementary School, Conference Room A.

Mrs. Linda Weller indicated that a final copy of the New Board of Education Member Orientation Manual had been provided to the Board members for review. **BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Albion Central School District, Orleans and Genesee Counties, New York, declares:**

**Section 1. The vacancies and propositions hereinafter set forth are hereby authorized to be submitted for the approval of the qualified voters at the annual school district election to be held in said School District on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2018.**

**Section 2. The School District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to include as a part of the notice of the annual district meeting and election notice with reference to the submission of said proposition in substantially the following form:**

Notice is hereby given by the Board of Education of the Albion Central School District, Orleans County and Genesee County, New York, as follows:

Section 1: That the Annual Budget Hearing of the qualified voters of said School District shall be held in the LGI Room in the Charles C. D'Amico High School Building, 302 East Avenue, in Albion, New York, in said School District on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 2018, at 7:00 P.M. EDST, for the presentation of the proposed budget. Further, all propositions, resolutions, candidates for the office of Member of the Board of Education and the school budget, will be voted on during the Annual Meeting between the hours of 12:00 o'clock noon and 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, EDST on Tuesday, May 15, 2018 at said Ronald L. Sodoma Elementary School Building, 324 East Avenue, Conference Room A, located at the community entrance on the south side of the Elementary School.

Section 2: That a copy of the statement of the amount of money which will be required for the ensuing year for school purposes, exclusive of public monies, will be available to any resident of the District during the fourteen (14) days immediately preceding the Annual Meeting except Saturday, Sunday or holidays, at each or any of the following locations:

1. High School, 302 East Avenue
2. Middle School, 254 East Avenue
3. Elementary School, 324 East Avenue
4. District Office, 324 East Avenue

The statement is available during the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 3:00 P.M. EDST.

Section 3: The following vacancies are to be filled on the Board of Education:

Petitions nominating candidates for the office of Member of the Board of Education must be filed with the Clerk of the District no later than 5:00 P.M. EDST on April 16, 2018. Each petition must be directed to the Clerk of the District, must be signed by at least twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the District, must state the name and address of each signer, must state name and residence of the candidate; residence must be by house number (where one has been assigned) and by name of road, not RFD or PO Box. The candidates receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected to the vacant five (5) year terms.

Section 4: That the following propositions shall be presented to the voters of the District to be voted upon:

PROPOSITION No. 1 SCHOOL BUDGET

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Albion Central School District of Orleans and Genesee Counties New York be authorized to expend the sum of thirty-five million, two hundred twenty-five thousand, six hundred twenty-five dollars (\$35,225,625) during the fiscal year 2018-19 and a general tax levied thereon.

PROPOSITION No. 2 BUS PURCHASE

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education be authorized to appropriate an amount of four hundred ninety thousand dollars (\$490,000) from the Albion Central School Bus Purchase Reserve Fund to purchase buses for the 2019-2020 school year.

PROPOSITION NO. 3 CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to-wit:

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Albion Central School District, Orleans and Genesee Counties, New York, is hereby authorized to establish a reserve fund (to be known as the "Capital Reserve Fund") in an ultimate amount of seven million one hundred ninety-five thousand dollars (\$7,195,000), with a probable term of ten (10) years, with the purposes and source thereof being as follows:

a) To provide funds for repairs, improvements, alterations, renovations, reconstruction and protection of all school buildings including machinery, equipment, apparatus or furnishings required or purposes of such buildings, including playgrounds, recreation areas, parking areas, roadways, and sidewalks connected to such buildings as permitted by the Local Finance Law.

b) The source of the funds for such Reserve Fund shall be as follows: from budgetary appropriations, un-appropriated fund balances, revenues that are not required by law to be paid into any other fund or account, and funds received from state building Aid.

NOTICE IS HEREBY FURTHER GIVEN that the aforesaid proposition may appear on the ballot labels of the voting machines used at such Annual District Meeting in the following abbreviated form due to space constraints:

CAPITAL RESERVE FUND PROPOSITION

Shall the proposition set forth in the notice of this meeting authorizing the establishment of a capital reserve fund to be designated "2020 Capital Reserve Fund", with an ultimate amount of seven million one hundred ninety-five thousand dollars (\$7,195,000), a term of 10 years, and appropriation of available fund balance and other legally available funds to such Capital Reserve Fund, be approved?

In such case, the full text of said proposition will be posted at all voting locations and will be available in the office of the School District Clerk where it may be examined during normal office hours.

PROPOSITION No. 4 HOAG LIBRARY

Shall the following resolution be adopted, to-wit:

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Albion Central School District of Orleans County and Genesee Counties, New York, pursuant to the provisions of Section 259 of the Education Law of the State of New York, be authorized and empowered to raise an annual sum of seven hundred fourteen thousand, nine hundred twenty dollars (\$714,920) for library purposes; that this amount be raised by tax levy during the school year for support of the maintenance and operations of the Hoag Library of the Swan Library Association; and that this sum be in addition to the funds raised to meet the estimated expenditures of the School District, in the form commonly known as the School District Budget.

The vote upon the candidates and propositions to be submitted to the qualified voters shall be by ballot, or voting machines, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to have the necessary ballots prepared for said voting machines, in form corresponding as nearly as may be with the requirements of the Education Law of the State of New York and the voting machine rules.

Absentee ballots may be requested by mail from the District Clerk up to seven (7) days prior to the election at the following address:

Absentee ballots may be requested in person up to one (1) day prior to the election at the same address. Absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 P.M. the day of the election in the District Clerk's office at 324 East Avenue, in completed form to be considered valid.

Section 5: That the School District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice to be given of said Annual District Meeting in substantially the form herein before prescribed, by publishing the same four times within the seven weeks next preceding such District Meeting, the first publication to be at least forty-five days before said meeting, in The Daily News, a newspaper having a general circulation in said School District, and by giving such other notice, as in such Clerk's discretion, may be deemed advisable.

Section 6: This resolution shall take effect immediately.
