## Registration For New Students

Albion Central School registers new students in the registrar's office located in the district office, 324 East Avenue, Albion.

Parents must register their children.

Please bring the child's ORIGINAL DOCUMENTATION: birth certificate or hospital certificate and record of immunization data.

NYS law requires all children must be immunized prior to attending school. No child will be admitted to school or allowed to attend school without appropriate certificates of immunization against Diphtheria, Pertussis (whooping cough), Tetanus, Polio, Measles, Rubella (German measles), Mumps, Hepatitis B, Varicella (chickenpox), and Meningococcal.

When applicable, a custody document must be provided if the student does not live with either natural parent. Only family court documents are accepted.

A copy of the last report card, copy of IEP (Individual Education Plan) if applicable, and address of school previously attended is appreciated for those who have attended school elsewhere.

**\*\*ALL students entering Albion Central School District must have proof of a current physical. Examinations shall be acceptable if administered not more than 12 months prior to the start of the school year.**

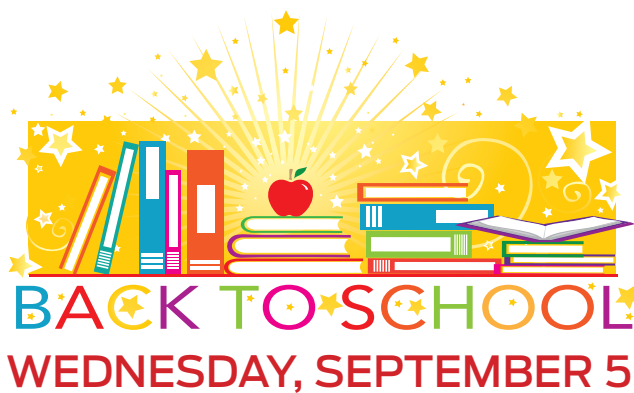

## A Message from the Superintendent Michael Bonnewell...

Welcome to the new Purple Eagle school year!

This copy of "The Link" contains important notifications for the new year. This week's edition of "The Pennysaver" also includes the district calendar. In addition to the dates of many school events, the district calendar reviews important information including open house, parent teacher conference, homecoming and community pool usage; the district directory, including Board of Education information; directions to access sport schedules, and the district code of conduct; and health information including immunization and physical requirements.

While these two documents and the district website ([www.albionk12.org](http://www.albionk12.org)) provide much of the information you will need this year, I encourage you to watch for mail and flyers from school and to contact the appropriate person with additional questions you may have.

### New York State Education Law Health Examination Requirements

As part of a required school health examination, a student is weighed and his/her height is measured. New York State Education Law requires that districts calculate students' body mass index (BMI) using this information. The BMI may help health care professionals determine if the students' weight is in a healthy range or is too high or too low. Please remember that this is only one measurement and is not used in isolation to make healthcare decisions. This information will remain confidential in each student's health record.

The State Education Department (SED) may select a number of districts to participate in a survey designed by the New York State Department of Health. If our school is selected to participate, we will be reporting specific information to the Department of Health. Districts will be responsible for sharing weight status information. No names and no information about individual students will be sent or shared. As the parent/guardian, you may choose to have your child's information excluded from this survey report. The information being sent to the NYS Department of Health will help to develop programs and services that make it easier for children to be healthier.

The Ronald L. Sodoma Elementary School staff is very excited to welcome our Purple Eagles back for the 2018-2019 year on **Sept. 5**. We know that they will have a great year, but that the first couple of days can bring on nervous feelings. We are ready to help our elementary eagles get settled into their classrooms and routines. Parents of Pre-K and Kindergarten students, please read through the information just for you after the general information!

### General Information Pre-K-5th Grade

#### Classroom Assignments:

Classroom assignments and back to school information will be mailed out around the second week of August. This letter will give you the teacher's name and classroom number for your child. We encourage all parents and students to visit the school on Open Campus Day Wed., Aug, 29, between 9 a.m. and 12 p.m. to help your child become familiar with the location of his/her classroom. Our Main Office staff and administration will be available to assist you with questions. Also, our summer office hours are Mon. - Fri. 9 a.m. - 3 p.m.

#### Transportation:

**Did you move?** If you have moved over the summer, please contact the elementary school (589-2030) and the bus garage (589-2070) to change your new address by Fri., Aug. 31.

**Do you have a child pick-up or drop-off bus transportation location that is not your home?** If your child will be picked up and/or dropped off at a location other than your home (i.e. babysitter, grandparent, etc), you must fill out the transportation form EVERY YEAR, even if your child was transported to the same location the prior year. Please contact the elementary school office at 589-2030 or stop in to pick up your form no later than Fri., Aug. 31.

#### Registration Card:

(The card identifies emergency information and persons authorized to sign out your child.) All students must have a new registration card filled out every year with current address, parent/guardian information; and names of emergency/persons with phone numbers authorized to sign out your child.

#### Coming to School and getting to the classroom the first two days:

- **Buses may run a little later than normal the first few days of school.** Please be patient, but if you have a question about typical pick-up or drop-off times, or your child's bus, then please call the bus garage 589-2070.
- **Please label your child's backpack, or give them a card or name tag with their first and last name and teacher's name on it.**
- **If you are driving your child to school, please enter the elementary driveways from Clarendon Road, and**

not by the HS tennis courts. Our drop-off drive-thru and park & walk-in greeters will be at their posts every day at 8:50 a.m. for the EAST GYM (by the big red and blue playground). You will be invited to walk your child to their classroom on the first two days of school. Please alert the staff in the gym if you are new to our building, or if you don't know who your child's teacher is, as we will bring you to the main office for extra assistance.

- **Students who will eat breakfast at school will come into the building first at 8:50 a.m., we will then welcome in students by grade level.**

#### Going home the first few days:

Buses may run later than usual the first few days of school.

#### Are you picking up your child from school?

Sign out for student pickup is in the East Gym and will begin at 2:45 p.m. Student registration cards will be checked, and a dismissal pass will be issued. Parents will go to classrooms to pick their children up the first two days of school. Starting Fri., Sept. 7, the children will come to the East Gym for pick up. Please review our drop-off morning and pick-up in the afternoon procedures carefully.

#### Please check your child's backpack for important information!

Many teachers send home lots of important things the first week of school. You don't want to miss out on important information.

#### Just for Pre-K Students:

Pre-kindergarten parents will receive a schedule in the mail of which day their child will be attending class during the first week of classes. The first regular session for **Pre-K** students will be on **Mon., Sept. 10**.

#### Just for Kindergarten Students:

We encourage parents of kindergarten students to attend the **Kindergarten Orientation on Wed., Aug. 29 from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m.** The purpose of this orientation is for your child to meet their teacher and see their new classroom. Kindergarten classrooms are closest to the big red and blue playground.

Kindergarten parents are requested to keep and have their child wear the bus tag (received in the mail) the first **two** weeks of school. This helps staff to identify kindergarten students and get them on the right bus home. Another very helpful thing to do is to label backpacks with their First and Last name and teacher's name.

#### Attention Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten parents:

Pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students will not be dropped off at their homes unless the bus driver sees an adult outside, or in a window, or standing in the door. If a driver does not see an adult, the child will be brought back to school and the parent will have to call to come and pick up the child. If you want an older sibling to take your child off the bus, please go to the elementary school and fill out a permission form.

### Opening of School

Grade 7 and 8 students at the middle school will report to their homeroom at 7:43 a.m. At that time, students will be given their schedules for the year.

Grade 6 students will report to the middle school auditorium where they will be greeted by their teachers.

Dismissal will be at 2:23 p.m.

### Late Arrivals/Leaving Early

For students leaving early, parents must write a note excusing the absence. The student must bring it during homeroom to the main office to receive an “early dismissal pass.” At the appointed time, the student reports to the main office to await the person who will be signing him/her out. Students WILL NOT be allowed to leave the building on their own. If a parent is unable to pick up his/her child, then another adult (18 years or older and listed on the release form), may sign the student out.

### Student Attendance

In order for students to succeed in school and meet state expectations, it is imperative that students maintain regular attendance. We ask parents and guardians to assist us in this matter. We will be completing home visits for students not in regular attendance. If he/she will not be in school, please call 589-2021 before 9 a.m. to report the absence.

### Assignment Notebooks, etc.

During the first week of school, homeroom teachers will hand out assignment notebooks to sixth graders. All students will receive student handbooks along with various forms that need to be filled out, signed by parents, and returned to their teachers. These forms MUST be returned by Mon., Sept. 10 so school personnel can finalize the indexing of student information.

The student handbook should be taken home to parents to be read together as it contains important information pertinent to both students and parents.

Included in the handbook is a listing of office phone numbers that parents will need to reach the appropriate office for absences, medical concerns, guidance concerns, and main office personnel. It may be helpful to “POST” these numbers where they are easily accessible.

### Breakfast

Breakfast will be available from 7:35 - 7:58 a.m. in the cafeteria. Students will not be admitted to breakfast after 7:38 a.m.

### Community Parking

All visitors must park in the designated “VISITOR PARKING” area, regardless of the reason for their presence in the building(s). Parking in non-marked parking spaces or in fire lanes is prohibited.

### Opening Day

When students return to school they should report directly to their homeroom. Students will receive their schedules in the mail or at Freshman Orientation. It is important students bring schedules with them on Sept. 5. Students will report to their scheduled homeroom at the start of the day. All schedule changes will be addressed during homeroom by completing a request for change form. Do not report directly to guidance.

### Student Parking Permits

If you are interested in receiving a parking permit, be sure you pick up a parking permit request form in the high school office. The cost of the permit is \$10.00 per year. Parking will be on a first come, first serve basis.

### Attendance

Chronic absenteeism is proven to have a significant negative impact on student achievement. Please review the attendance guidelines (in the student handbook and on the ACS website) and make regular and timely attendance a top priority in 2018-19.

### Cell Phones

1. Pay attention to the signs (red, green, yellow lights): Cell phones can only be used in some areas and there are times where you cannot use your phone.
2. Music or other noise should not be heard coming from your device, ear-buds, or headphones.
3. Even when you are allowed to use your phone/device, you cannot:
  - a. Photograph or film others without consent
  - b. Use portable speakers to project sound
  - c. Use social media to bully/harass
  - d. Send or receive profane or inappropriate material
  - e. Engage in plagiarism or cheating
  - f. Make or receive phone calls without permission
  - g. Use inappropriate apps

## Videotaping of Classrooms

New York State now requires that student teachers include a videotape of their classroom experience as part of their curriculum. If your child has a student teacher, they may be videotaped in the classroom. No student will be individually identified by their last name in the video. If you **do not** want your student included in this component of a student teacher's course work, please call the district office at 585-589-2055.

## Albion Central School District Initial Notification Pursuant to Section 409H of State Education Law

New York State Education Law Section 409H, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Albion Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in area inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt material under 40CFR152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18-fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets.

In addition, there will be no written notice of such application when a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application.

In the event an emergency application is necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. ## Asbestos Inspection Information

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), asbestos reinspections were performed in each of our school buildings for asbestos containing building materials. The inspection findings are in the asbestos management plan and are on file in each school administrative office and our central administration office.

The EPA requires us to perform periodic inspection every 6 months and triennial re-inspections of the asbestos materials every three years. Six month periodic inspections were also performed, submitted to the District and filed for review. In January 2016 a 3-year Triennial Inspection was performed and a certified asbestos planner reviewed the results.

No significant findings were noted during the reinspection of our school buildings. All asbestos materials in our schools remain in good condition, and we will continue to manage them in place as recommended by EPA guidelines and the NYS DOL certified asbestos management planner.

Results of the inspections are on file in three locations: 1) the District Central Administrative Office, 2) the School Administrative Offices, and 3) the Office of the Director of Facilities.

# Notification of Rights Under the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA)

PPRA affords parents certain rights regarding our conduct of surveys, collection and use of information for marketing purposes, and certain physical exams. These include the right to:

Consent before students are required to submit to a survey that concerns one or more of the following protected areas (“protected information survey”) if the survey is funded in whole or in part by a program of the U.S. Department of Education (ED)-

- Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student’s parent;
- Mental or psychological problems of the student or student’s family;
- Sex, behavior or attitudes;
- Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
- Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
- Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers;
- Religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or parents; or
- Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility.

Receive notice and an opportunity to opt a student out of -

- Any other protected information survey, regardless of funding;
- Any non-emergency, invasive physical exam or screening required as a condition of attendance, administered by the school or its agent, and not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of a student, except for hearing, vision, or scoliosis screenings, or any physical exam or screening permitted or required under State law;
- Activities involving collection, disclosure, or use of personal information obtained from students for marketing or to sell or otherwise distribute the information to others;

Inspect, upon request and before administration or use;

- Protected information surveys of students;
- Instruments used to collect personal information from students for any of the above marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes; and
- Instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum.

These rights transfer from the parents to a student who is 18 years old or an emancipated minor under state law.


Albion Central School has developed and adopted policies, in consultation with parents, regarding these rights, as well as arrangements to protect student privacy in the administration of protected information surveys and the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes. Albion Central School will directly notify parents of these policies at least annually at the start of each school year and after any substantive changes. The Albion Central School will also directly notify, such as through U.S. Mail or email, parents of students who are scheduled to participate in the specific activities or surveys, other than those noted below and will provide an opportunity for the parent to opt his or her child out of participation in the specific activity or survey. The Albion Central School will make this notification to parents at the beginning of the school year if the District has identified the specific or approximate dates of the activities or surveys at that time. For surveys and activities scheduled after the school year starts, parents will be provided reasonable notification of the planned activities and surveys listed below and be provided an opportunity to opt their child out of such activities and surveys. Parents will also be provided an opportunity to review any pertinent surveys. Following is a list of the specific activities and surveys covered under this requirement:

- Collection, disclosure, or use of personal information for marketing, sales or other distribution.
- Administration of any protected information survey not funded in whole or in part by ED.
- Any non-emergency, invasive physical examination or screening as described above.

## Notification of Rights under FERPA for Elementary and Secondary Schools Access to Student Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age (“eligible students”) certain rights with respect to the student’s education records. These rights are:

- (1) The right to inspect and review the student’s education records within 45 days of the day the School receives a request for access.

Parents or eligible students should submit to the School principal [or appropriate school official] a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The School official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

- (2) The right to request an amendment of the student’s education records that the parent or eligible student believes to be inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student’s privacy rights under FERPA.

Parents or eligible students who wish to ask the school to amend a record should write the School principal [or appropriate school official], clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it should be changed. If the school decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the School will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

- (3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student’s education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the school as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the school has contracted as its agent to provide a service instead of using its own employees or officials (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

Upon request, the school discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

- (4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the School District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA are:

In addition to the rights outlined above, FERPA also gives the school district the option of designating certain categories of student information as “directory information.” Directory information includes a student’s name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major course of study, participation in school activities or sports, weight and height if a member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, most recent school attended, class schedule, photograph, e-mail address, and class roster. You may object to the release of any or all of this “directory information;” however you must do so in writing to the building principal by the end of September each school year. If we do not receive a written objection, we will be authorized to release any or all of this “directory information” without your consent.

## Release of Directory Information under FERPA

Unless objection to any of the specific items in the following “Directory Information” is submitted in writing by parents, legal guardians or those students over the age of 18 years, the Albion Central School District herewith gives notice of intention to provide, release or publish in the district or building newsletters; school or student newspapers; school website, yearbooks or other publications; daily or weekly newspapers; athletic programs; musical, theatrical or award programs; news releases and school related organizations any or all of the following directory information pertaining to students as may be appropriate under the circumstances: the student’s name, student’s photograph, parent’s name, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received and the most recent previous education agency or institution attended by the student.

Under the regulations of this act, parents, guardians or students over the age of 18 who do not desire the release of any of the above directory information must make a specific request in writing to the Superintendent of Schools by Sept. 30. Failure to make such request shall be deemed consent to release, provide or publish directory information during the current school year.

*Please Note: Although not considered directory information, student created work, video or audio recordings, or electronic images may be used without prior consent in order to publicize or promote a school district program. If you wish to refuse permission for the use of your student’s work, video or audio recordings, or electronic images in district publications, media releases or district website, you must notify the building principal in writing by the end of September each school year.*

## BUS TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

All students are eligible for busing. MS and HS students in the village will be picked up by bus **at corners**. Please review the busing routes in this LINK issue to determine changes and where your child will be picked up. Please keep in mind that for the first few days of school, the buses will be running a little later than normal in the afternoon. The schedule will adjust within a few days.

The parking lot on the north side of the Elementary school immediately in front of the building is for **bus parking ONLY**. If you are dropping off or picking up a student, please use the **Clarendon Street** entrance.

**BUS GARAGE HOURS:** Open during the school year from 6:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. After hours, please leave messages on voicemail at 589-2070.

### If Your Child Will Be Transported To/From A Residence Other Than Your Home...

New York State Education Law obligates the district to transport students to and from their residence in accordance with defined limits. However, we understand that the babysitter's residence becomes the school bus stop for many of our students. ACS D will, therefore, honor requests for transportation to and/or from a point other than the family residence **on an annual basis**. **EACH YEAR, a transportation form must be completed to request transportation from an address other than your home.**

**Requests are honored one time only.** The district and the parents are obligated to the agreement for the entire school year. **The district will not approve bus stops on differing days for any individual student or adjust a student's bus assignment after the beginning of the school year unless you change your residence.** This determination is based on the district's requirement to ensure safe and secure transportation for every student. Emergency or extenuating circumstances shall be handled through respective building principals. The district is prohibited from transporting students to after school

organizations such as Scouts, 4-H, dancing class, music lessons, or to a friend's house. Requests of this nature are not considered "emergencies" and will not be honored by the District. It is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to provide transportation to and from these non-school related activities.

**If you want the bus to pick up or drop off your child at a residence other than your own home, you MUST fill out a transportation form EACH YEAR.** Forms can be obtained at each building office. Information cannot be accepted over the phone. Parent notes regarding bus changes are not accepted. **A form must be filled out no later than Aug. 31.** If applications are received later than that date, it may take up to one week to process them. If you have questions, please contact the district at 589-2056 or the bus garage at 589-2070.

**Waiting for the bus:** All students must be outside in a visible location **10 minutes before** the scheduled bus arrival time. When substitute drivers are placed on a route, they do not have house numbers of students. They are given the streets to pick up/drop off. Substitutes look for children standing by the road for pick up. **Buses are not allowed to honk their horns for students to catch the bus.**

### Important Information for Pre-K & Kindergarten Student Transportation Home:

**Pre-kindergarten students** will not be dropped off at their homes unless the bus driver sees an adult outside, in a window or standing in the door. If a driver does not see an adult, the child will be brought back to school and the parent will have to come and pick up the child.

**Kindergarten students** will not be dropped off at their home unless the bus driver sees an adult at home or they are riding with an older sibling. Kindergarteners will be dismissed at 3:20 p.m. and will ride the elementary school bus home. The buses leave the elementary school at 3:30 p.m.

**\*\* Attention Oak Orchard Estate Students** Bus stops will be at the main office parking lot or by the mailboxes on North Street.
