Students who have needed support throughout the school year will review skills with SLANT (System for Structured Language Training), which provides personalized, research-based, multi-sensory language training to struggling readers; as well as through the use of technology programs, Lexia Strategies for Older Readers and Reading Plus. Each day, students will be actively engaged while working on these programs as well as engaging in reader's theater, reading for fluency and playing vocabulary/word games.
